A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to establishing residency for purposes of admission into

3 public schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 25.001, Education Code, is amended by 6 adding Subsections (c-1) and (c-2) to read as follows:

7 (c-1) A person whose parent or guardian is an active-duty

8 <u>member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state</u>

9 military forces or a reserve component of the armed forces, may

10 <u>establish residency for purposes of Subsection (b) by providing to</u>

11 the school district a copy of a military order requiring the

12 parent's or guardian's transfer to a military installation in or

13 <u>adjacent to the district's attendance zone.</u>

14 <u>(c-2)</u> A person who establishes residency as provided by

15 Subsection (c-1) shall provide to the school district proof of

16 residence in the district's attendance zone not later than the 10th

17 day after the arrival date specified in the order described by that

18 <u>subsection</u>. For purposes of this subsection, "residence" includes

19 <u>residence in a military temporary lodging facility.</u>

SECTION 2. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, as amended by

21 Chapters 324 (S.B. 1488), 522 (S.B. 179), and 735 (S.B. 1153), Acts

22 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and
