A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of state death benefits to certain members of the Texas military forces. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 615.003, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 615.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to eligible survivors of the following individuals: 8 9 (1) an individual: elected, appointed, or employed as a peace 10 (A) officer by the state or a political subdivision of the state under 11 12 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law; or 13 (B) employed as a peace officer by a private 14 institution of higher education, including a private junior college, that is located in this state under Section 51.212, 15 Education Code; 16 a paid probation officer appointed by the director 17 (2) of a community supervision and corrections department who has the 18 duties set out in Section 76.002 and the qualifications set out in 19 20 Section 76.005, or who was appointed in accordance with prior law; 21 (3) a parole officer employed by the Texas Department 22 of Criminal Justice who has the duties set out in Section 508.001 23 and the qualifications set out in Section 508.113 or in prior law; 24 (4) a paid jailer;

No. 1618 (5) a member of an organized police reserve or 1 auxiliary unit who regularly assists peace officers in enforcing 2 3 criminal laws; 4 (6) a member of the class of employees of the 5 correctional institutions division formally designated as custodial personnel under Section 615.006 by the Texas Board of 6 Criminal Justice or its predecessor in function; 7 8 (7) a jailer or guard of a county jail who is appointed 9 by the sheriff and who: 10 (A) performs a security, custodial, or supervisory function over the admittance, confinement, 11 or discharge of prisoners; and 12 is certified by the Texas Commission on Law 13 (B) 14 Enforcement; 15 (8) a juvenile correctional employee of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; 16 17 (9) an employee of the Health and Human Services Commission [Department of Aging and Disability Services or 18 Department of State Health Services] who: 19 20 (A) works at the <u>commission's</u> [department's] maximum security unit; or 21 22 performs on-site services for the (B) Texas Department of Criminal Justice; 23 24 (10)an individual who is employed by the state or a political or legal subdivision and is subject to certification by 25 the Texas Commission on Fire Protection; 26 27 (11)an individual employed by the state or а

No. 1618 1 political or legal subdivision whose principal duties are aircraft crash and rescue fire fighting; 2 3 (12)a member of an organized volunteer fire-fighting unit that: 4 5 (A) renders fire-fighting services without remuneration; and 6 7 (B) conducts a minimum of two drills each month, 8 each two hours long; (13) an individual who: 9 10 (A) performs emergency medical services or operates an ambulance; 11 is employed by a political subdivision of the 12 (B) state or is an emergency medical services volunteer as defined by 13 14 Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code; and 15 (C) is qualified as an emergency care attendant or at a higher level of training under Section 773.046, 773.047, 16 17 773.048, 773.049, or 773.0495, Health and Safety Code; (14)individual who is employed or 18 an formally designated as a chaplain for: 19 an organized volunteer fire-fighting unit or 20 (A) other fire department of this state or of a political subdivision of 21 22 this state; 23 (B) a law enforcement agency of this state or of a 24 political subdivision of this state; or 25 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; (C) 26 (15) an individual who is employed by the state or a political subdivision of the state and who is considered by the 27

3 (16) an individual who is employed by the Department4 of Public Safety and, as certified by the director, is:

5 (A) deployed into the field in direct support of 6 a law enforcement operation, including patrol, investigative, 7 search and rescue, crime scene, on-site communications, or special 8 operations; and

9 (B) given a special assignment in direct support 10 of operations relating to organized crime, criminal interdiction, 11 border security, counterterrorism, intelligence, traffic 12 enforcement, emergency management, regulatory services, or special 13 investigations; [<del>or</del>]

14 (17) an individual who is employed by the Parks and 15 Wildlife Department and, as certified by the executive director of 16 the Parks and Wildlife Department, is:

(A) deployed into the field in direct support of
a law enforcement operation, including patrol, investigative,
search and rescue, crime scene, on-site communications, or special
operations; and

(B) given a special assignment in direct support of operations relating to organized crime, criminal interdiction, border security, counterterrorism, intelligence, traffic enforcement, emergency management, regulatory services, or special investigations; or

26 (18) a member of the Texas military forces, as defined
27 by Section 437.001:

1 (A) who performs a military duty or is on state 2 active duty, as those terms are defined in Section 437.001; and 3 (B) whose eligible survivors are not otherwise 4 eligible under federal law to receive a payment under 10 U.S.C. 5 Sections 1475 through 1477 in relation to that duty. 6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act relating to the death of a member of the Texas military forces applies only in 7 relation to a death that occurs on or after the effective date of 8 this Act. Matters regarding eligibility, payment, and benefits 9 under Chapter 615, Government Code, in relation to a death that 10 occurs before the effective date of this Act are governed by the law 11 in effect on the date the death occurs, and the former law is 12

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13 continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
