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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to making supplemental appropriations and reductions in 3 appropriations and giving direction, including direction regarding 4 reimbursement, and adjustment authority regarding appropriations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: PUBLIC FINANCE 7 AUTHORITY. The unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund to the Public Finance Authority made by Chapter 605 8 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the 9 General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal 10 11 biennium ending August 31, 2019, for bond debt service payments, including appropriations subject to Rider 3, page I-48, Chapter 605 12 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the 13 14 General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the appropriations to the authority, are reduced by a total aggregate 15 of \$35,078,954. The authority shall identify the strategies and 16 objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount 17 of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives. 18

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: FACILITIES COMMISSION. 19 20 The unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund to 21 the Facilities Commission made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 22 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the 85th General 23 Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium 24 ending August 31, 2019, for lease payments are reduced by

\$17,589,128. The commission shall identify the strategies and
 objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount
 of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives.

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4 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: TEXAS EDUCATION 5 AGENCY; SUM-CERTAIN APPROPRIATION FOR FOUNDATION SCHOOL PROGRAM. The unencumbered appropriations from the Foundation School 6 (a) 7 Fund No. 193 to the Texas Education Agency made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 8 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal 9 biennium ending August 31, 2019, for Strategy A.1.1., FSP -10 Equalized Operations, as listed in that Act, are reduced by 11 12 \$643,000,000.

(b) Notwithstanding Rider 3, page III-5, Chapter 605 (S.B. 14 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the 15 General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the 16 appropriations to the Texas Education Agency, the sum-certain 17 appropriation to the Foundation School Program for the state fiscal 18 year ending August 31, 2019, is \$21,919,735,602.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: HEALTH 19 AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION. The unencumbered appropriations from the 20 economic stabilization fund to the Health and Human Services 21 Commission made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th 22 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations 23 24 Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, for Strategy G.4.2., Facility Capital 25 Repairs and Renovations, as listed in that Act, and subject to Rider 221(b), 26 page II-111, Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, 27

Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), to the bill
 pattern of the appropriations to the authority, are reduced by
 \$2,000,000.

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4 SECTION 5. LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES COMMISSION: ADDITIONAL 5 APPROPRIATIONS. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$4,400,000 is 6 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Library and 7 8 Archives Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for renovating the Promontory Point 9 10 Drive facility in the City of Austin, Texas, for the storage of public records. 11

SECTION 6. HEALTH AND 12 HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: REPLACEMENT OF MONEY TRANSFERRED TO ADDRESS NEEDS RESULTING FROM 13 14 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated 15 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$110,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Health 16 17 and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for Medicaid client services under Strategy 18 19 A.1.5., Children, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the (the 20 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 General Appropriations Act), to replace money transferred from that 21 strategy to disaster assistance programs to address needs resulting 22 23 from Hurricane Harvey.

SECTION 7. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: MEDICAID SHORTFALL. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,100,000,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund, and \$2,300,000,000 is

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appropriated from federal funds, to the Health and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for Medicaid client services under Goal A, Medicaid Client Services, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

6 SECTION 8. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: STATE 7 HOSPITALS. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the 8 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Health and 9 10 Human Services Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for continuing improvements to state 11 12 hospital facilities under Strategy G.4.2., Facility Capital Repairs and Renovations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of 13 14 the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General 15 Appropriations Act), as follows:

16 (1) \$1,000,000 for preplanning activities related to17 construction of a new state hospital in the Panhandle region; and

18 (2) \$1,000,000 for preplanning activities related to19 construction of a new state hospital in the Dallas area.

SECTION 9. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES: 20 21 FOSTER CARE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$83,542,916 is 22 23 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of 24 Family and Protective Services for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for foster care payments under Strategy B.1.9., 25 26 Foster Care Payments, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 27 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General

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1 Appropriations Act).

SECTION 10. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES: 2 RELATIVE CAREGIVER PAYMENTS. 3 (a) In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 4 5 31, 2019, \$6,833,593 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the state 6 fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for relative caregiver payments 7 8 under Strategy B.1.11., Relative Caregiver Payments, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular 9 10 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

(b) The unencumbered appropriations from federal Temporary 11 Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds to the Department of 12 Family and Protective Services made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of 13 14 the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General 15 Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, for relative caregiver payments under 16 17 Strategy B.1.11., Relative Caregiver Payments, as listed in that Act, are reduced by \$8,481,040. 18

SECTION 11. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES: 19 DAY CARE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the 20 21 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$23,060,052 is appropriated from federal Child Care and Development Block Grant 22 funds to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the 23 24 state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for day care payments under Strategy B.1.3., TWC Contracted Day Care, as listed in 25 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular 26 27 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

SECTION 12. TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY: EXPENSES RELATED TO 1 HURRICANE HARVEY. (a) In addition to amounts previously 2 3 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, following amounts are appropriated from 4 the the economic 5 stabilization fund to the Texas Education Agency for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for Strategy A.1.1., FSP -6 Equalized Operations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 7 8 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for the following purposes related to the 9 10 increased state costs under the Foundation School Program resulting from Hurricane Harvey: 11

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(1) \$271,300,000 for:

(A) increased student costs;

14 (B) the reduction in school district property 15 values; and

16 (C) the reduction of the amount owed by school 17 districts under Chapter 41, Education Code, due to disaster 18 remediation costs as provided by Section 41.0931, Education Code; 19 and

(2) \$634,200,000 for the adjustment of school district
property values under Section 42.2523, Education Code, and
reimbursement to school districts for disaster remediation costs
under Section 42.2524, Education Code.

(b) In addition to other amounts appropriated for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2020, \$636,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas Education Agency for that state fiscal year for the increased state costs under the

Foundation School Program resulting from the reduction in school
 district property values associated with Hurricane Harvey.

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3 SECTION 13. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON: EXPENSES RELATED TO 4 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated 5 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$20,288,883 6 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the 7 University of Houston for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 8 2019, for expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

9 SECTION 14. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON - DOWNTOWN: EXPENSES 10 RELATED TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously 11 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, 12 \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to 13 the University of Houston - Downtown for the state fiscal year 14 ending August 31, 2019, for expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

15 SECTION 15. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON - VICTORIA: EXPENSES 16 RELATED TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously 17 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, 18 \$1,703,828 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to 19 the University of Houston - Victoria for the state fiscal year 20 ending August 31, 2019, for expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

SECTION 16. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON - CLEAR LAKE: EXPENSES RELATED TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$83,668 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the University of Houston - Clear Lake for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

27 SECTION 17. LONE STAR COLLEGE SYSTEM: EXPENSES RELATED TO

HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$13,100,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Lone Star College System for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

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6 SECTION 18. TEXAS A&M FOREST SERVICE: EXPENSES RELATED TO 7 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated 8 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,582,439 is 9 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas A&M 10 Forest Service for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for 11 expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

SECTION 19. TEXAS A&M FOREST SERVICE: WILDFIRES. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$54,923,481 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas A&M Forest Service for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for expenses related to wildfires.

SECTION 20. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: REPLACEMENT OF 18 MONEY TRANSFERRED TO ADDRESS NEEDS RESULTING FROM HURRICANE HARVEY. 19 In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal 20 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$38,600,000 is appropriated from 21 the economic stabilization fund to the Department of Criminal 22 23 Justice for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for agency 24 operations expenses under Strategy C.1.1., Correctional Security Operations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th 25 26 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), to replace money transferred from that strategy to disaster 27

assistance programs to address needs resulting from Hurricane
 Harvey.

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DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: CORRECTIONAL 3 SECTION 21. MANAGED HEALTH CARE. In addition to 4 amounts previously 5 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$160,000,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the 6 Department of Criminal Justice for the state fiscal year ending 7 8 August 31, 2019, for correctional managed health care under Strategy C.1.9., Hospital and Clinical Care, as listed in Chapter 9 10 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 11 (the General Appropriations Act).

SECTION 22. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: CORRECTIONAL 12 OFFICER OVERTIME. In addition to amounts previously appropriated 13 14 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$30,000,000 15 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of Criminal Justice for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, 16 17 for correctional officer overtime under Strategy C.1.1., Correctional Security Operations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 18 19 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act). 20

SECTION 23. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY: EXPENSES RELATED 21 HARVEY. 22 ТО HURRICANE In addition to amounts previously 23 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, 24 following amounts are appropriated from the economic the stabilization fund to the Department of Public Safety for the state 25 26 fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for the following strategies as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, 27

Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for agency
 operations expenses related to Hurricane Harvey:

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3 (1) \$35,000,000 for Strategy A.1.1., Organized Crime;
 4 (2) \$60,000,000 for Strategy C.1.1., Traffic
 5 Enforcement; and

6 (3) \$2,000,000 for Strategy G.1.3., Information7 Technology.

8 SECTION 24. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY: CRIME LABORATORIES. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for 9 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$5,770,426 is 10 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of 11 Public Safety for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for 12 Strategy E.1.1., 13 crime laboratory operations under Crime 14 Laboratory Services, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 15 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act). 16

SECTION 25. PARKS AND WILDLIFE DEPARTMENT: EXPENSES RELATED 17 ТО HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to 18 amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, 19 \$9,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to 20 21 the Parks and Wildlife Department for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for Strategy D.1.1., Improvements and Major 22 Repairs, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th 23 24 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for expenses related to Hurricane Harvey. 25

26 SECTION 26. TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION: EXPENSES RELATED TO 27 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated

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1 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$8,931,385 is 2 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas 3 Workforce Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 4 2019, for Strategy A.2.1., Vocational Rehabilitation, as listed in 5 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular 6 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for vocational 7 rehabilitation services expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

8 SECTION 27. REIMBURSEMENT TO ECONOMIC STABILIZATION FUND. 9 If any state agency or public institution of higher education 10 receives reimbursement from the federal government, an insurer, or 11 another source for an expenditure paid from money appropriated by 12 this Act:

(1) the agency or institution shall reimburse the state in an amount equal to the lesser of the amount appropriated under this Act and spent for that expenditure or the amount reimbursed by the other source for that expenditure; and

17 (2) the comptroller of public accounts shall deposit
18 the amount of the reimbursement to the credit of the economic
19 stabilization fund.

20 SECTION 28. EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) Subject to Subsection (b) 21 of this section, this Act takes effect immediately.

(b) Sections 6, 8, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 23, 25,
and 26 of this Act take effect only if this Act receives a vote of
two-thirds of the members present in each house of the legislature,
as provided by Section 49-g(m), Article III, Texas Constitution.
