## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to the provision of pharmacy services through a
3	telepharmacy system.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 562.110(e), Occupations Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(e) The board shall adopt rules regarding the use of a
8	telepharmacy system under this section, including:
9	(1) the types of health care facilities at which a
10	telepharmacy system may be located under Subsection (d)(1), which
11	must include the following facilities:
12	(A) a clinic designated as a rural health clinic
13	regulated under 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x(aa); [and]
14	(B) a health center as defined by 42 U.S.C.
15	Section 254b;
16	(C) a federally qualified health center as
17	<pre>defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 1396d(1)(2)(B);</pre>
18	(D) an ambulatory surgical center;
19	(E) a birthing center;
20	(F) a community health center;
21	(G) a hospital;
22	(H) an outpatient clinic; and
23	(I) a public health clinic;
24	(2) the locations eligible to be licensed as remote

- 20 (E) a requirement that a pharmacist employed by a
- 21 provider pharmacy be physically present at a remote dispensing site
- 22 when the pharmacist is providing services requiring the physical
- 23 presence of the pharmacist, including immunizations;
- 24 (F) a requirement that a remote dispensing site
- 25 be staffed by an on-site pharmacy technician who is under the
- 26 continuous supervision of a pharmacist employed by the provider
- 27 pharmacy;

- (G) a requirement that all pharmacy technicians at a remote dispensing site be counted for the purpose of establishing the pharmacist-pharmacy technician ratio of the provider pharmacy, which, notwithstanding Section 568.006, may not exceed three pharmacy technicians for each pharmacist providing supervision;
- 7 (H) a requirement that, before working at a 8 remote dispensing site, a pharmacy technician must:
- 9 (i) have worked at least one year at a 10 retail pharmacy during the three years preceding the date the 11 pharmacy technician begins working at the remote dispensing site; 12 and
- (ii) have completed a board-approved training program on the proper use of a telepharmacy system;
- (I) a requirement that pharmacy technicians at a remote dispensing site may not perform extemporaneous sterile or nonsterile compounding but may prepare commercially available medications for dispensing, including the reconstitution of orally administered powder antibiotics; and
- (J) any additional training or practice 21 experience requirements for pharmacy technicians at a remote 22 dispensing site;
- 23 (4) the areas that qualify under Subsection (f);
- 24 (5) recordkeeping requirements; and
- 25 (6) security requirements.
- SECTION 2. Sections 562.110(g), (h), and (i) Occupations 27 Code, as added by Chapter 485 (H.B. 2561), Acts of the 85th

- 1 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, are repealed.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
