2	relating to discussing with a patient the risks of certain
3	controlled substance prescriptions.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 481.0764, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Subsections (f) and (g) to read as follows:
7	(f) A prescriber, other than a veterinarian, on issuance of
8	the initial prescription for a Schedule II controlled substance or
9	an opioid, shall discuss with the patient and, if the patient is a
10	minor, the patient's parent, conservator, or guardian, or other
11	person authorized to consent to the minor's medical treatment:

- 12 <u>(1) the risk of addiction associated with the drug</u>
- 13 prescribed, including any risk of developing a physical or
- 14 psychological dependence on the drug;
- 15 (2) the risk of overdose associated with the drug
- 16 prescribed; and
- 17 (3) the danger of taking the drug with
- 18 benzodiazepines, alcohol, or other central nervous system
- 19 <u>depressants</u>.
- 20 <u>(g) A prescriber who discusses the risks of a controlled</u>
- 21 substance prescription under Subsection (f) shall note the
- 22 discussion in the patient's medical record.
- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 24 to a prescription issued on or after the effective date of this Act.

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- 1 A prescription issued before the effective date of this Act is
- 2 governed by the law in effect on the date the prescription is
- 3 issued, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
