A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the core curriculum at public institutions of higher 3 education. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.821(1), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (1) "Core curriculum" means the <u>basic</u> curriculum in liberal arts, humanities, and sciences and political, social, and 8 9 cultural history that all undergraduate students of an institution of higher education are expected to know and are required to 10 11 complete before receiving an academic undergraduate degree. SECTION 2. Section 61.822, Education Code, is amended by 12 13 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as 14 follows: Each institution of higher education shall adopt a core 15 (b) curriculum of no less than 42 semester credit hours, including 16 specific courses comprising the curriculum. The core curriculum 17 shall: 18 (1) consist only of courses that: 19 20 (A) are listed in: 21 (i) the common course numbering system 22 approved by the board; and 23 (ii) the board's manual of general academic transfer courses that may be offered for state funding by public 24

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1 junior colleges, public state colleges, and public technical
2 institutes; or

3 (B) are the equivalent of courses described by
4 Paragraph (A), as determined by the board; and

5 (2) be consistent with [the common course numbering 6 system approved by the board and with] the statement, 7 recommendations, and rules issued by the board.

8 (b-1) An institution may have a core curriculum of other 9 than 42 semester credit hours only if approved by the board.

10 SECTION 3. Section 130.0104(b), Education Code, is amended 11 to read as follows:

12 (b) A multidisciplinary studies associate degree program 13 established at a junior college under this section must require a 14 student to successfully complete:

(1) the junior college's core curriculum adopted under
Section <u>61.822</u> [<u>61.822(b)</u>]; and

17 (2) after completion of the core curriculum under
18 Subdivision (1), the courses selected by the student in the
19 student's degree plan completed under Subsection (c).

20 SECTION 4. Sections 61.821 and 61.822, Education Code, as 21 amended by this Act, apply beginning with the 2020-2021 academic 22 year.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
