A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the consideration of employee compensation and benefits
- 3 in establishing the rates of electric and gas utilities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 36, Utilities Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 36.066 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 36.066. CONSIDERATION OF COMPENSATION AND BENEFIT
- 8 EXPENSES. (a) In this section, "employee compensation and
- 9 benefits" includes base salaries, wages, incentive compensation,
- 10 and benefits. The term does not include pension and other
- 11 postemployment benefits.
- (b) When establishing an electric utility's rates, the
- 13 regulatory authority shall presume that employee compensation and
- 14 benefits expenses are reasonable and necessary if the expenses are
- 15 consistent with recent market compensation studies.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 104, Utilities Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 104.060 to read as follows:
- 18 <u>Sec. 104.060. CONSIDERATION OF COMPENSATION AND BENEFIT</u>
- 19 EXPENSES. (a) In this section, "employee compensation and
- 20 benefits" includes base salaries, wages, incentive compensation,
- 21 and benefits. The term does not include pension and other
- 22 postemployment benefits.
- 23 (b) When establishing a gas utility's rates, the regulatory
- 24 authority shall presume that employee compensation and benefits

- 1 expenses are reasonable and necessary if the expenses are
- 2 consistent with recent market compensation studies.
- 3 SECTION 3. (a) Sections 36.066 and 104.060, Utilities Code,
- 4 as added by this Act, apply only to a proceeding for the
- 5 establishment of rates for which the regulatory authority has not
- 6 issued a final order or decision before the effective date of this
- 7 Act.
- 8 (b) A proceeding for which the regulatory authority has
- 9 issued a final order or decision before the effective date of this
- 10 Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date,
- 11 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
