## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a statewide alert system for missing
3	adults and to a study of the alert system.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter Q to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER Q. ALERT FOR MISSING ADULTS
8	Sec. 411.461. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Adult" means a person who is 18 years of age or
10	older but younger than 65 years of age.
11	(2) "Alert" means the statewide alert for missing
12	adults that is developed and implemented under this subchapter.
13	(3) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law
14	enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of a
15	missing adult.
16	Sec. 411.462. ALERT FOR MISSING ADULTS. With the
17	cooperation of the Texas Department of Transportation, the office
18	of the governor, and other appropriate law enforcement agencies in
19	this state, the department shall develop and implement a system to
20	allow a statewide alert to be activated on behalf of a missing
21	adult.

Sec. 411.463. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The director is the

(b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as

- 1 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert system. The
- 2 rules and directives must include:
- 3 (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 4 enforcement agency to verify whether an adult is missing and:
- 5 (A) in imminent danger of bodily injury or death;
- 6 (B) living with a proven mental or physical
- 7 disability, as documented by a source determined credible by an
- 8 appropriate law enforcement agency; or,
- 9 <u>(C) that circumstances indicate, as</u> determined
- 10 by an appropriate law enforcement agency, that the disappearance of
- 11 the missing adult may not have been voluntary, including an
- 12 abduction or kidnapping.
- 13 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 14 local law enforcement agency is required to report a missing adult
- 15 to the department; and
- 16 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 17 entity to report information about a missing adult to designated
- 18 media outlets in this state.
- 19 (c) The director shall prescribe forms for use by local law
- 20 enforcement agencies in requesting activation of the alert system.
- Sec. 411.464. DEPARTMENT TO RECRUIT PARTICIPANTS. The
- 22 <u>department shall recruit public and commercial television and radio</u>
- 23 broadcasters, private commercial entities, state or local
- 24 governmental entities, the public, and other appropriate persons to
- 25 assist in developing and implementing the alert system.
- Sec. 411.465. STATE AGENCIES. (a) A state agency
- 27 participating in the alert system shall:

1 (1) cooperate with the department and assist in 2 developing and implementing the alert system; and (2) establish a plan for providing relevant 3 information to its officers, investigators, or employees, as 4 5 appropriate, once the alert system has been activated. 6 (b) In addition to its duties as a state agency under Subsection (a), the Texas Department of Transportation shall 7 8 establish a plan for providing relevant information to the public through an existing system of dynamic message signs located across 9 10 the state. Sec. 411.466. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING ADULT. 11 12 (a) A local law enforcement agency shall notify the department if 13 the agency: 14 (1) receives a report regarding a missing adult; 15 (2) verifies that at the time the adult is reported 16 missing: 17 (A) the person reported missing is 18 years of age or older but younger than 65 years of age; 18 19 (B) the adult's location is unknown; and 20 (C) the adult has been missing for less than 72 21 hours; 22 (3) confirms that a preliminary investigation has taken place with respect to the disappearance and that, as a result 23 24 of that investigation, the agency believes that the missing adult is qualified under section 411.463; and 25 26 (4) believes sufficient information is available to

disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the adult, a

- 1 person suspected of abducting the adult, or a vehicle suspected of
- 2 being used by the adult or in any abduction of the adult.
- 3 (b) The department may modify the criteria described by
- 4 Subsection (a) as necessary for the proper implementation of the
- 5 alert system.
- 6 Sec. 411.467. ACTIVATION OF ALERT. (a) When a local law
- 7 enforcement agency notifies the department under Section 411.466,
- 8 the department shall confirm the accuracy of the information and,
- 9 if confirmed, immediately issue an alert under this subchapter in
- 10 accordance with the department's rules and directives under Section
- 11 411.463.
- 12 (b) The department may issue the alert on its own
- 13 initiative, without receiving the notification described by
- 14 Subsection (a), if the issuance conforms to the department's rules
- and directives and if the criteria described by Section 411.466(a)
- 16 <u>are satisfied</u>.
- 17 (c) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the
- 18 alert to designated media outlets in this state. Following receipt
- 19 of the alert, participating radio stations and television stations
- 20 and other participating media outlets may issue the alert at
- 21 <u>designated intervals to assist in locating the missing adult.</u>
- 22 <u>(d) The department shall also send the alert to:</u>
- 23 (1) any appropriate law enforcement agency;
- 24 (2) the Texas Department of Transportation;
- 25 (3) the Texas Lottery Commission; and
- 26 (4) the Independent Bankers Association of Texas.
- 27 Sec. 411.468. CONTENT OF ALERT. The alert must include:

- 1 (1) all appropriate information that may lead to the
- 2 safe recovery of the missing adult, as determined by the
- 3 department; and
- 4 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 5 information related to the missing adult to contact a local or state
- 6 law enforcement agency.
- 7 Sec. 411.469. TERMINATION OF ALERT. (a) The director shall
- 8 terminate any activation of the alert with respect to a particular
- 9 missing adult not later than the earlier of the date on which:
- 10 (1) the missing adult is located or the situation is
- 11 otherwise resolved; or
- 12 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by
- 13 department rule.
- 14 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing
- 15 adult who is the subject of an alert under this subchapter shall
- 16 notify the department as soon as possible that the missing adult has
- 17 been located.
- 18 SECTION 2. (a) The Department of Public Safety of the State
- 19 of Texas shall conduct a study on the effectiveness of the statewide
- 20 alert system described by Subchapter Q, Chapter 411, Government
- 21 Code, as added by this Act. The study must investigate whether the
- 22 statewide alert system fulfills the purpose for which the alert
- 23 system was created and whether the alert system should be modified
- 24 or expanded.
- 25 (b) Not later than December 31, 2020, the Department of
- 26 Public Safety of the State of Texas shall submit to the governor,
- 27 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives a

- 1 report containing the results of the study conducted under
- 2 Subsection (a) of this section, including any recommendations for
- 3 proposed legislation.
- 4 (c) This section expires December 31, 2021.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
