5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 531.021611 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 531.021611. ACTION PLAN TO EXPAND TELEMEDICINE MEDICAL
8	SERVICES AND TELEHEALTH SERVICES. (a) The commission shall
9	develop and implement an action plan to:
10	(1) expand the use of and increase access to
11	telemedicine medical services, telehealth services, and related
12	mobile applications for those services by health care providers for
13	the residents of this state; and
14	(2) increase the availability of critical medical care
15	and health care services to residents in this state in areas
16	determined by the commission to be medically underserved, including
17	the border region and rural areas.

- 18 (b) In developing and implementing the action plan under
- 19 <u>Subsection (a), the commission shall:</u>
- 20 <u>(1) seek the assistance of the Texas Hospital</u>
- 21 Association, the Texas Medical Association, teaching hospitals,
- 22 and the statewide health coordinating council; and
- 23 (2) consult with health care providers, advocacy
- 24 groups, relevant federal agencies, and any other interested persons

- 1 the commission considers necessary to develop the action plan
- 2 required by this section.
- 3 (c) The action plan developed under Subsection (a) must
- 4 include:
- 5 (1) short-term and long-term plan recommendations,
- 6 <u>including policy initiatives and reforms necessary to implement the</u>
- 7 plan;
- 8 (2) statutory and administrative reforms necessary to
- 9 implement the plan; and
- 10 (3) options for the funding necessary to implement the
- 11 plan.
- 12 (d) The commission shall:
- 13 (1) not later than September 1, 2021:
- 14 (A) submit to the governor and the legislature
- 15 the recommendations, the statutory and administrative reforms, and
- 16 the funding options described in Subsection (c) and short-term and
- 17 long-term plans to implement those recommendations, reforms, and
- 18 options; and
- 19 (B) begin implementing the short-term plan;
- 20 (2) not later than September 1, 2023, fully implement
- 21 the short-term plan;
- 22 (3) not later than September 1, 2029, fully implement
- 23 the long-term plan; and
- 24 (4) include the short-term and long-term plans in the
- 25 update of the strategic plan for health and human services under
- 26 Section 531.022, Government Code.
- 27 <u>(e) This section expires September 1, 2030.</u>
