AN ACT

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter L, Chapter 441, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 441.1825 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 441.1825. STATE INFORMATION GOVERNANCE COORDINATOR.
- 8 (a) The director and librarian shall employ a state information
- 9 governance coordinator in the commission's records management
- 10 division.

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- 11 (b) The state information governance coordinator shall:
- 12 (1) ensure records management programs are
- implemented by state agencies for all media types;
- 14 (2) assist state agencies in complying with the
- 15 agencies' records management programs;
- 16 (3) increase overall awareness and outreach for state
- 17 agency records management programs; and
- 18 <u>(4) coordinate with the Department of Information</u>
- 19 Resources to ensure state agencies comply with this subchapter and
- 20 the strategy developed under Section 2054.069.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 441.183, Government Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 441.183. RECORDS MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS IN STATE
- 24 AGENCIES. (a) The agency head of each state agency shall:

- 1 (1) establish and maintain a records management
- 2 program on a continuing and active basis;
- 3 (2) create and maintain records containing adequate
- 4 and proper documentation of the organization, functions, policies,
- 5 decisions, procedures, and essential transactions of the agency
- 6 designed to furnish information to protect the financial and legal
- 7 rights of the state and any person affected by the activities of the
- 8 agency;
- 9 (3) make certain that all records of the agency are
- 10 passed to the agency head's successor in the position of agency
- 11 head;
- 12 (4) identify and take adequate steps to protect
- 13 confidential and vital state records;
- 14 (5) cooperate with the commission in the conduct of
- 15 state agency records management surveys; and
- 16 (6) cooperate with the commission, the director and
- 17 librarian, and any other authorized designee of the director and
- 18 librarian in fulfilling their duties under this subchapter.
- 19 (b) This subsection applies only to a state agency that is a
- 20 department, commission, board, office, or other agency in the
- 21 <u>executive branch of state government.</u> This subsection does not
- 22 apply to an institution of higher education, as defined by Section
- 23 <u>61.003</u>, Education Code. As part of a records management program
- 24 established under Subsection (a), the agency head of a state agency
- 25 to which this subsection applies shall require training for agency
- 26 employees, annually and on employment with the agency, regarding
- 27 the records management program, including the agency's approved

- 1 records retention schedule.
- 2 SECTION 3. Subchapter L, Chapter 441, Government Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Sections 441.1856 and 441.1857 to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 Sec. 441.1856. TEXAS DIGITAL ARCHIVE. (a) The commission
- 6 shall maintain and operate a digital repository for the
- 7 preservation of and access to permanently valuable archival state
- 8 records, reports, and publications.
- 9 (b) The commission, in collaboration with the Department of
- 10 Information Resources, shall develop a strategy, consistent with
- 11 state records management and archival practices, for state agencies
- 12 to transfer appropriate archival state records that are in
- 13 electronic format to the commission for inclusion in the digital
- 14 repository described by Subsection (a).
- Sec. 441.1857. DATA CLASSIFICATION, SECURITY, AND
- 16 RETENTION REQUIREMENTS. At the initiation of a project, a state
- 17 agency shall classify the data produced from or used in the project
- 18 and determine appropriate data security and retention requirements
- 19 for each classification.
- SECTION 4. Section 2054.0286, Government Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 Sec. 2054.0286. CHIEF DATA OFFICER [STATEWIDE DATA
- 23 COORDINATOR]. (a) The executive director, using existing
- 24 department funds, shall employ a chief data officer [statewide data
- 25 coordinator] to:
- 26 (1) improve the control and security of information
- 27 collected by state agencies;

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- 1 (2) promote between state agencies the sharing of
- 2 information, including customer information; [and]
- 3 (3) reduce information collection costs incurred by
- 4 this state; and
- 5 (4) assist the department in the development and
- 6 management of a data portal for use by state agencies.
- 7 (b) The <u>chief data officer</u> [statewide data coordinator]
- 8 shall develop and implement best practices among state agencies to:
- 9 (1) improve interagency information coordination;
- 10 (2) reduce duplicative information collection;
- 11 (3) increase accountability and ensure compliance
- 12 with statutes and rules requiring agencies to share information;
- 13 (4) improve information management and analysis to
- 14 increase information security, uncover fraud and waste, reduce
- 15 agency costs, improve agency operations, and verify compliance with
- 16 applicable laws;
- 17 (5) encourage agencies to collect and post on the
- 18 agencies' Internet websites or the data portal managed by the
- 19 $\underline{\text{department}}$ information related to $\underline{\text{an agency's}}$ [$\underline{\text{agency}}$] functions $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 20 other data maintained by the agency that is in an open file format
- 21 and is machine-readable, exportable, and easily accessible by the
- 22 public; and
- 23 (6) encourage the evaluation of open document formats
- 24 for storing data and documents generated by state agencies.
- 25 (c) Each state agency shall cooperate with the chief data
- 26 officer [statewide data coordinator] in fulfilling the
- 27 requirements of this section.

- 1 [(d) This section expires September 1, 2021.]
- 2 SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 2054.069 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 2054.069. STRATEGY FOR DATA STORAGE. (a) In this
- 5 section, "statewide technology center" has the meaning assigned by
- 6 Section 2054.375.
- 7 (b) The department, in collaboration with the Texas State
- 8 Library and Archives Commission, shall develop a strategy for the
- 9 use of a statewide technology center for long-term non-archival
- 10 records storage.
- 11 SECTION 6. Subchapter F, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 2054.137 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 2054.137. DESIGNATED DATA MANAGEMENT OFFICER. Each
- 14 state agency with more than 150 full-time employees shall designate
- 15 <u>a full-time employee of the agency to serve as a data management</u>
- 16 officer. The data management officer shall:
- 17 (1) coordinate with the chief data officer under
- 18 Section 2054.0286; and
- 19 (2) consider posting the agency's open data on the data
- 20 portal managed by the department.
- 21 SECTION 7. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 22 of this Act, the Department of Information Resources shall adopt
- 23 rules to implement Section 2054.0286, Government Code, as amended
- 24 by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
