- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 441.003, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (f) to read as
- 7 follows:

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- 8 (a) Subject to the approval of the commission, the director
- 9 and librarian shall appoint an assistant state librarian, a state
- 10 archivist, a state records administrator, <u>a state information</u>
- 11 governance coordinator, and other assistants and employees
- 12 necessary to fulfill the duties of the commission and the director
- 13 and librarian as prescribed by law.
- 14 (f) The state information governance coordinator is a
- 15 position in the commission's records management division. The
- 16 coordinator shall:
- 17 (1) ensure records management programs are
- 18 <u>implemented by state agencies;</u>
- (2) assist state agencies in complying with the
- 20 agencies' records management programs; and
- 21 (3) increase overall awareness and outreach for state
- 22 agency records management programs.
- SECTION 2. Section 441.183, Government Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 441.183. RECORDS MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS IN STATE
- 2 AGENCIES. (a) The agency head of each state agency shall:
- 3 (1) establish and maintain a records management
- 4 program on a continuing and active basis;
- 5 (2) create and maintain records containing adequate
- 6 and proper documentation of the organization, functions, policies,
- 7 decisions, procedures, and essential transactions of the agency
- 8 designed to furnish information to protect the financial and legal
- 9 rights of the state and any person affected by the activities of the
- 10 agency;
- 11 (3) make certain that all records of the agency are
- 12 passed to the agency head's successor in the position of agency
- 13 head;
- 14 (4) identify and take adequate steps to protect
- 15 confidential and vital state records;
- 16 (5) cooperate with the commission in the conduct of
- 17 state agency records management surveys; and
- 18 (6) cooperate with the commission, the director and
- 19 librarian, and any other authorized designee of the director and
- 20 librarian in fulfilling their duties under this subchapter.
- 21 (b) As part of a records management program established
- 22 under Subsection (a), the agency head of a state agency shall
- 23 require training for agency employees, annually and on employment
- 24 with the agency, regarding the records management program,
- 25 including the agency's approved records retention schedule.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter L, Chapter 441, Government Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Section 441.1856 to read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 441.1856. DATA CLASSIFICATION, SECURITY, AND
- 2 RETENTION REQUIREMENTS. At the initiation of a project, a state
- 3 agency shall classify the data produced from or used in the project
- 4 and determine appropriate data security and retention requirements
- 5 for each classification.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 2054.0286, Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 2054.0286. CHIEF DATA OFFICER [STATEWIDE DATA
- 9 COORDINATOR]. (a) The executive director, using existing
- 10 department funds, shall employ a chief data officer [statewide data
- 11 coordinator] to:
- 12 (1) improve the control and security of information
- 13 collected by state agencies;
- 14 (2) promote between state agencies the sharing of
- 15 information, including customer information; [and]
- 16 (3) reduce information collection costs incurred by
- 17 this state; and
- 18 (4) assist the department in the development and
- 19 management of a data portal for use by state agencies.
- 20 (b) The chief data officer [statewide data coordinator]
- 21 shall develop and implement best practices among state agencies to:
- 22 (1) improve interagency information coordination;
- 23 (2) reduce duplicative information collection;
- 24 (3) increase accountability and ensure compliance
- 25 with statutes and rules requiring agencies to share information;
- 26 (4) improve information management and analysis to
- 27 increase information security, uncover fraud and waste, reduce

- 1 agency costs, improve agency operations, and verify compliance with
- 2 applicable laws;
- 3 (5) encourage agencies to collect and post on the
- 4 agencies' Internet websites or the data portal managed by the
- 5 department information related to an agency's [agency] functions or
- 6 other data maintained by the agency that is in an open file format
- 7 and is machine-readable, exportable, and easily accessible by the
- 8 public; and
- 9 (6) encourage the evaluation of open document formats
- 10 for storing data and documents generated by state agencies.
- 11 (c) Each state agency shall cooperate with the <u>chief data</u>
- 12 officer [statewide data coordinator] in fulfilling the
- 13 requirements of this section.
- 14 [(d) This section expires September 1, 2021.]
- 15 SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 2054.069 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 2054.069. STRATEGY FOR DATA STORAGE. (a) In this
- 18 section:
- 19 (1) "Archival state record" has the meaning assigned
- 20 by Section 441.180.
- 21 (2) "Statewide technology center" has the meaning
- 22 assigned by Section 2054.375.
- 23 (b) The department, in collaboration with the Texas State
- 24 Library and Archives Commission, shall develop a strategy for state
- 25 agencies, consistent with state records management and archival
- 26 practices, regarding the:
- 27 (1) transfer of appropriate archival state records of

- 1 the agency that are in electronic format to the commission for
- 2 <u>inclusion in the state archives program established under Section</u>
- 3 441.181; and
- 4 (2) use of a statewide technology center for long-term
- 5 non-archival records storage.
- 6 SECTION 6. Subchapter F, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 2054.137 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 2054.137. DESIGNATED DATA MANAGEMENT OFFICER. Each
- 9 state agency with more than 150 full-time employees shall designate
- 10 <u>a full-time employee of the agency to serve as a data management</u>
- 11 officer. The data management officer shall:
- 12 <u>(1) coordinate with the chief data</u> officer under
- 13 <u>Section 2054.0286; and</u>
- 14 (2) consider posting the agency's open data on the data
- 15 portal managed by the department.
- SECTION 7. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 17 of this Act, the Department of Information Resources shall adopt
- 18 rules to implement Section 2054.0286, Government Code, as amended
- 19 by this Act.
- 20 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
