- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 21, Labor Code, is amended 20
- 21 by adding Section 21.0023 to read as follows:
- 22 Sec. 21.0023. DEFINITION OF EMPLOYER FOR SEXUAL HARASSMENT
- CLAIM. For purposes of a claim under this chapter based on sexual 23
- harassment, the term "employer" means: 24

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- 1 (1) a person who is engaged in an industry affecting
- 2 commerce and who has one or more employees for each working day in
- 3 each of 20 or more calendar weeks in the current or preceding
- 4 <u>calendar year</u>;
- 5 (2) an agent of a person described by Subdivision (1);
- 6 (3) an individual elected to public office in this
- 7 <u>state or a political subdivision of this state; or</u>
- 8 (4) a county, municipality, state agency, or state
- 9 <u>instrumentality</u>, regardless of the number of individuals employed.
- 10 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 11 to a claim of sexual harassment based on conduct that occurs on or
- 12 after the effective date of this Act. A claim of sexual harassment
- 13 that is based on conduct that occurs before the effective date of
- 14 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the conduct
- 15 occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 16 purpose.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
