A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to invoices and payments under certain state contracts for

- 3 outside legal services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 402.0212, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and
- 7 (b-3) to read as follows:
- 8 (b) An invoice submitted to a state agency under a contract
- 9 for legal services as described by Subsection (a) must be:
- 10 (1) submitted to the attorney general by the agency's
- 11 office of general counsel not later than the 25th day after the date
- 12 the agency receives the invoice except as provided by Subsection
- 13 (b-2); and
- 14 (2) reviewed by the attorney general only to determine
- 15 whether the legal services for which the agency is billed were
- 16 performed within the term of the contract and are within the scope
- 17 of the legal services authorized by the contract and are therefore
- 18 [the invoice is] eligible for payment.
- 19 (b-1) A state agency's office of general counsel shall
- 20 <u>include with an invoice submitted under Subsection (b)(1) a written</u>
- 21 certification that the legal services for which the agency is
- 22 billed were performed within the term of the contract, are within
- 23 the scope of the legal services authorized by the contract, and are
- 24 reasonably necessary to fulfill the purpose of the contract. To

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- 1 certify an invoice under this subsection, a state agency must, at a
- 2 minimum, determine that the following items are supported by proper
- 3 documentation and submitted to the agency under the requirements of
- 4 the contract:
- 5 (1) the amount and types of expenses billed under the
- 6 <u>invoice;</u>
- 7 (2) the rates for legal services under the invoice;
- 8 and
- 9 <u>(3) the number of hours billed for legal services</u>
- 10 under the invoice.
- 11 (b-2) If a state agency that receives an invoice under a
- 12 contract for legal services as described by Subsection (a) rejects
- 13 or disputes the invoice as not certifiable under Subsection (b-1),
- 14 the agency shall, not <u>later than the 21st day after the date the</u>
- 15 agency receives the invoice, notify the attorney or law firm
- 16 providing the invoice and request a corrected invoice. The period
- 17 under Subsection (b)(1) begins on the date the agency receives a
- 18 corrected invoice that is certifiable under Subsection (b-1).
- 19 (b-3) If the attorney general rejects or disputes an invoice
- 20 and certification submitted by a state agency under this section,
- 21 the attorney general shall notify the agency that the invoice is not
- 22 eligible for payment. A state agency may submit a corrected invoice
- 23 and certification, and the requirements of Subsections (b), (b-1),
- 24 and (b-2) apply to the corrected invoice and certification.
- 25 SECTION 2. Section 2251.021, Government Code, is amended by
- 26 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 27 follows:

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- 1 (a) Except as <u>otherwise</u> provided by <u>this section</u>
- 2 [Subsection (b)], a payment by a governmental entity under a
- 3 contract executed on or after September 1, 1987, is overdue on the
- 4 31st day after the later of:
- 5 (1) the date the governmental entity receives the
- 6 goods under the contract;
- 7 (2) the date the performance of the service under the
- 8 contract is completed; or
- 9 (3) the date the governmental entity receives an
- 10 invoice for the goods or service.
- 11 (b-1) A payment under a contract for legal services
- 12 <u>described by Section 402.0212 owed by a state agency is overdue on</u>
- 13 the 46th day after the date the agency receives an invoice for the
- 14 legal services.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
