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- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,
- 8 is amended by adding Section 502.061 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 502.061. REGISTRATION BY OWNER WITH CONDITION THAT
- 10 IMPEDES COMMUNICATION. (a) An application for registration must
- 11 provide space for the applicant to voluntarily list any health
- 12 condition that may impede communication with a peace officer as
- 13 evidenced by:
- 14 (1) for a physical health condition, a written
- 15 statement from a licensed physician; or
- 16 (2) for a mental health condition, a written statement
- 17 from a licensed physician, a licensed psychologist, or a
- 18 <u>non-physician mental health professional</u>, as defined by Section
- 19 <u>571.003</u>, Health and Safety Code.
- 20 (b) The department shall provide to the Department of Public
- 21 Safety the vehicle registration information of a person who
- 22 voluntarily lists a health condition on an application under
- 23 Subsection (a).
- (c) The Department of Public Safety shall establish a system

- 1 to include information received under Subsection (b) in the Texas
- 2 Law Enforcement Telecommunications System for the purpose of
- 3 alerting a peace officer who makes a traffic stop that the operator
- 4 of the stopped vehicle may have a health condition that may impede
- 5 communication.
- 6 (d) The department may not issue a license plate with a
- 7 visible marking that indicates to the general public that a person
- 8 voluntarily listed a health condition on an application under
- 9 Subsection (a).
- SECTION 2. Sections 521.142(e-1) and (h), Transportation
- 11 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (e-1) Subject to Subsection (h)(2), other [Other] than a
- 13 general inquiry as to whether the applicant has a mental condition
- 14 that may affect the applicant's ability to safely operate a motor
- 15 vehicle, an application may not include an inquiry regarding the
- 16 mental health of the applicant, including an inquiry as to whether
- 17 the applicant has been diagnosed with, treated for, or hospitalized
- 18 for a psychiatric disorder.
- 19 (h) The application must provide space for the applicant to
- 20 voluntarily list any health condition that may impede communication
- 21 with a peace officer as evidenced by:
- (1) for a physical health condition, a written
- 23 statement from a licensed physician; or
- 24 (2) for a mental health condition, a written statement
- 25 <u>from a licensed physician, a licensed psychologist, or a</u>
- 26 non-physician mental health professional, as defined by Section
- 27 571.003, Health and Safety Code.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
