5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,

8	LIABILITY. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Anaphylaxis" means a sudden, severe, and
10	potentially life-threatening allergic reaction that occurs when a
11	person is exposed to an allergen.
12	(2) "Epinephrine auto-injector" means a disposable
13	medical drug delivery device that contains a premeasured single
14	dose of epinephrine intended for use to treat anaphylaxis.
15	(3) "Physician" means a person who holds a license to
16	practice medicine in this state.
17	(b) A physician, or a person who has been delegated
18	prescriptive authority under Chapter 157, Occupations Code, may
19	prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors in the name of a day-care
20	<u>center.</u>
21	(c) A physician or other person who prescribes epinephrine
22	auto-injectors under Subsection (b) shall provide the day-care
23	center with a standing order for the administration of an
24	epinephrine auto-injector to a person reasonably believed to be

2 (d) A standing order under Subsection (c) is not required to be patient-specific. An epinephrine auto-injector may be 3 administered under this section to a person without a previously 4 5 established physician-patient relationship. 6 (e) Notwithstanding any other law, supervision or 7 delegation by a physician is considered adequate if the physician: 8 (1) periodically reviews the order; and 9 (2) is available through direct telecommunication as needed for consultation, assistance, and direction. 10 (f) An order issued under this section must contain: 11 12 (1) the name and signature of the prescribing physician or other person; 13 14 (2) the name of the day-care center to which the order 15 is issued; 16 (3) the quantity of epinephrine auto-injectors to be 17 obtained and maintained under the order; and (4) the date the order was issued. 18 19 (g) A pharmacist may dispense an epinephrine auto-injector to a day-care center without requiring the name of or any other 20 identifying information relating to the user. 21 22 (h) A day-care center shall store an epinephrine auto-injector in a secure location that is easily accessible to 23 24 employees or volunteers of the day-care center authorized and trained to administer an epinephrine auto-injector. 25 26 (i) Each day-care center is responsible for training

2	(1) include information on:
3	(A) recognizing the signs and symptoms of

9	(D) implementing emergency procedures, if

11	(E) the proper disposal of used or expired
12	epinephrine auto-injectors; and
13	(2) be completed annually in a formal training session
14	or through online education.
15	(j) Each day-care center shall maintain records on the
16	training required under this section.
17	(k) Not later than the 10th business day after the date a
18	day-care center employee administers an epinephrine auto-injector
19	in accordance with this section, the day-care center shall report
20	the following information to the persons listed in Subsection (1):
21	(1) the age of the person who received the
22	administration of the epinephrine auto-injector;
23	(2) whether the person who received the administration
24	of the epinephrine auto-injector was:
25	(A) a child enrolled in the day-care center;
26	(B) a day-care center employee or volunteer; or
27	(C) a visitor to the day-care center;

1	(3) the physical location where the epinephrine
2	auto-injector was administered;
3	(4) the number of doses of epinephrine auto-injector
4	administered;
5	(5) the title of the employee who administered the
6	epinephrine auto-injector; and
7	(6) any other information required by the executive
8	commissioner.
9	(1) The information required by Subsection (k) shall be
10	reported to:
11	(1) the owner of the day-care center;
12	(2) the physician or other person who prescribed the
13	epinephrine auto-injector;
14	(3) the commission; and
15	(4) the Department of State Health Services.
16	(m) The executive commissioner, in consultation with the
17	Department of State Health Services, shall adopt rules necessary to
18	implement this section.
19	(n) A person who in good faith takes, or fails to take,
20	action relating to the prescription of an epinephrine auto-injector
21	to a day-care center or the administration of an epinephrine
22	auto-injector in a day-care center is immune from civil or criminal
23	liability or disciplinary action resulting from that action or
24	failure to act, including:
25	(1) issuing an order for epinephrine auto-injectors;
26	(2) supervising or delegating the administration of an
27	epinephrine auto-injector;

1	(3) possessing, maintaining, storing, or disposing of
2	an epinephrine auto-injector;
3	(4) prescribing an epinephrine auto-injector;
4	(5) dispensing an epinephrine auto-injector;
5	(6) administering, or assisting in administering, an
6	epinephrine auto-injector;
7	(7) providing, or assisting in providing, training,
8	consultation, or advice in the development, adoption, or
9	implementation of policies, guidelines, rules, or plans; or
10	(8) undertaking any other act permitted or required
11	under this section.
12	(o) The immunities and protections provided by this section
13	are in addition to other immunities or limitations of liability
14	provided by law.
15	(p) Notwithstanding any other law, this section does not
16	create a civil, criminal, or administrative cause of action or
17	liability or create a standard of care, obligation, or duty that
18	provides a basis for a cause of action for an act or omission under
19	this section.
20	(q) If a day-care center obtains epinephrine auto-injectors
21	for use as authorized by this section, the day-care center shall
22	notify each parent of a child enrolled in the center of the center's
23	policy and procedures relating to the administration of the
24	epinephrine auto-injectors.
25	(r) An act or omission described by this section does not
26	create a cause of action.
27	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
