## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of massage therapy;
- 3 requiring a student permit; authorizing fees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 455.152, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 455.152. INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSE. [<del>(a)</del>] A person is
- 8 not eligible for a license as a massage establishment, massage
- 9 school, massage therapist, or massage therapy instructor if the
- 10 person is an individual and has been convicted of, entered a plea of
- 11 nolo contendere or guilty to, or received deferred adjudication for
- 12 an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or Subchapter A, Chapter
- 13 43, Penal Code, or another sexual offense.
- 14 [(b) A person convicted of a violation of this chapter is
- 15 ineligible for a license as a massage establishment, massage
- 16 school, massage therapist, or massage therapy instructor until the
- 17 <u>fifth anniversary of the date of the conviction.</u>]
- SECTION 2. Section 455.1525, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 Sec. 455.1525. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION
- 21 REQUIREMENT FOR LICENSE ISSUANCE [BACKGROUND CHECKS]. (a) The
- 22 department shall require an applicant for a license to submit a
- 23 complete and legible set of fingerprints, on a form prescribed by
- 24 the department, to the department or to the Department of Public

- 1 Safety for the purpose of obtaining criminal history record
- 2 information from the Department of Public Safety and the Federal
- 3 Bureau of Investigation [On receipt of an application for a license
- 4 under this chapter, the department shall conduct a criminal
- 5 background check on the applicant].
- 6 (b) The department may not issue a license to a person who
- 7 does not comply with the requirement of Subsection (a).
- 8 (c) The department shall conduct a criminal history record
- 9 information check of each applicant for a license using
- 10 <u>information:</u>
- 11 (1) provided by the individual under this section; and
- 12 (2) made available to the department by the Department
- 13 of Public Safety, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and any
- 14 other criminal justice agency under Chapter 411, Government Code.
- 15 <u>(d) The department may:</u>
- (1) enter into an agreement with the Department of
- 17 Public Safety to administer a criminal history record information
- 18 check required under this section; and
- 19 (2) authorize the Department of Public Safety to
- 20 collect from each applicant the costs incurred by the Department of
- 21 Public Safety in conducting the criminal history record information
- 22 <u>check.</u>
- (e) For purposes of this section, if the applicant for a
- 24 license is an entity, the applicant must submit fingerprints as
- 25 required by Subsection (a) for each individual who:
- 26 (1) personally or constructively holds, including as
- 27 the <u>beneficiary of a trust:</u>

- 1 (A) at least 10 percent of the entity's
- 2 outstanding stock; or
- 3 (B) more than \$25,000 of the fair market value of
- 4 the entity;
- 5 (2) has the controlling interest in the entity;
- 6 (3) has a direct or indirect participating interest
- 7 through shares, stock, or otherwise, regardless of whether voting
- 8 rights are included, of more than 10 percent of the profits,
- 9 proceeds, or capital gains of the entity;
- 10 (4) is a member of the board of directors or other
- 11 governing body of the entity; or
- 12 (5) serves as:
- 13 (A) an elected officer of the entity; or
- 14 (B) a general manager of the entity.
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 455.160(h), Occupations Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- (h) On receipt of a request for a renewal of a license issued
- 18 under this chapter, the department shall [may] conduct a criminal
- 19 background check under Section 455.1525.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 455, Occupations Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 455.161 to read as follows:
- Sec. 455.161. STUDENT PERMIT; ELIGIBILITY. (a) The
- 23 department shall require a student enrolled in a massage school in
- 24 this state to hold a permit stating the student's name and the name
- 25 of the school. The permit must be displayed in a reasonable manner
- 26 at the school.
- 27 (b) The department shall issue a student permit to an

- 1 applicant who submits an application to the department for a
- 2 student permit accompanied by any required fee.
- 3 (c) An applicant for a student permit described by this
- 4 <u>section</u> shall:
- 5 (1) submit an enrollment application to the department
- 6 <u>in a form and manner prescribed by the department; and</u>
- 7 (2) satisfy other requirements specified by the
- 8 department.
- 9 SECTION 5. Subchapter E, Chapter 455, Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Section 455.2035 to read as follows:
- Sec. 455.2035. REPORTS TO DEPARTMENT. (a) A massage school
- 12 shall maintain a monthly progress report regarding each student
- 13 attending the school. The report must certify the daily attendance
- 14 record of each student and the number of credit hours earned by each
- 15 student during the previous month.
- (b) On a student's completion of a prescribed course of
- 17 instruction, the school shall notify the department that the
- 18 student has completed the required number of hours and is eligible
- 19 to take the appropriate examination.
- 20 SECTION 6. Section 455.158, Occupations Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 7. Not later than March 1, 2020, the Texas
- 22 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules necessary
- 23 to implement the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 455,
- 24 Occupations Code.
- 25 SECTION 8. (a) Section 455.1525, Occupations Code, as
- 26 amended by this Act, applies only to an application for a license
- 27 submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An

- 1 application for a license submitted before that date is governed by
- 2 the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the
- 3 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 (b) Not later than September 1, 2021, the Texas Department
- 5 of Licensing and Regulation shall obtain criminal history record
- 6 information on each person who, on the effective date of this Act,
- 7 holds a license issued under Chapter 455, Occupations Code, and did
- 8 not undergo a criminal history record information check based on
- 9 the license holder's fingerprints on initial application for the
- 10 license. The department may suspend the license of a license holder
- 11 who does not provide the criminal history record information as
- 12 required by the department and this subsection.
- SECTION 9. Section 455.160(h), Occupations Code, as amended
- 14 by this Act, applies only to an application for the renewal of a
- 15 license submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 16 application submitted before that date is governed by the law in
- 17 effect on the date the application was submitted, and the former law
- 18 is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 10. (a) In this section, "massage school" has the
- 20 meaning assigned by Section 455.001, Occupations Code.
- 21 (b) Section 455.161, Occupations Code, as added by this Act,
- 22 applies to a student who is enrolled in a massage school on or after
- 23 June 1, 2020.
- SECTION 11. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 25 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
- 26 (b) Section 455.2035, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 27 Act, takes effect July 1, 2020.
