- 2 relating to the composition of the Governor's EMS and Trauma
- 3 Advisory Council.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 773.012(b) and (f), Health and Safety
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The advisory council is composed of the following $\underline{19}$
- 8 [15] members appointed by the governor:
- 9 (1) a board-certified emergency physician, appointed
- 10 from a list of names recommended by a statewide professional
- 11 association of emergency physicians;
- 12 (2) a licensed physician who is an emergency medical
- 13 services medical director, appointed from a list of names
- 14 recommended by a statewide professional association of emergency
- 15 medical services medical directors;
- 16 (3) <u>a registered nurse</u>, appointed from a list of names
- 17 recommended by a statewide professional association of emergency
- 18 <u>nurses;</u>
- 19 (4) a fire chief for a municipality that provides
- 20 emergency medical services, appointed from a list of names
- 21 recommended by a statewide fire chiefs association;
- (5) $\left[\frac{4}{1}\right]$ an officer or employee of a private
- 23 provider of emergency medical services who is involved with the
- 24 development of a Texas Trauma System, appointed from a list of names

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- 1 recommended by a statewide association of private providers of
- 2 emergency medical services;
- 3 (6) $\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ a volunteer who provides emergency medical
- 4 services, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide
- 5 association of volunteers;
- (7) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ an educator in the field of emergency
- 7 medical services;
- 8 (8) $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$ a member of an emergency medical services
- 9 air medical team or unit, appointed from a list of names recommended
- 10 by a statewide emergency medical services air medical association;
- (9) $[\frac{(8)}{}]$ a representative of a fire department that
- 12 provides emergency medical services, appointed from a list of names
- 13 recommended by a statewide association of firefighters;
- (10) $[\frac{(9)}{}]$ a representative of hospitals who is
- 15 affiliated with a hospital that is a designated trauma facility in
- 16 an urban community, appointed from a list of names recommended by a
- 17 statewide association of hospitals;
- (11) $[\frac{(10)}{}]$ a representative of hospitals, who is
- 19 affiliated with a hospital that is a designated trauma facility in a
- 20 rural community, appointed from a list of names recommended by a
- 21 statewide association of hospitals;
- (12) $[\frac{(11)}{(11)}]$ a representative of a county provider of
- 23 emergency medical services;
- (13) $\left[\frac{(12)}{(12)}\right]$ one licensed physician who is a
- 25 pediatrician with trauma or emergency care expertise;
- 26 $\underline{(14)}$ [$\frac{(13)}{}$] one trauma surgeon;
- 27 (15) [er] one registered nurse with trauma expertise;

- 1 (16) a representative of a stand-alone emergency
- 2 medical services agency in a municipality or taxing district,
- 3 appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide
- 4 association representing emergency medical services agencies;
- 5 (17) a certified paramedic, appointed from a list of
- 6 names recommended by a statewide association representing
- 7 emergency medical services agencies or emergency medical services
- 8 personnel; and
- 9 (18) [(14)] two representatives of the general public
- 10 who are not qualified to serve under another subdivision of this
- 11 subsection.
- 12 (f) Members of the advisory council serve staggered
- 13 six-year terms with the terms of six or seven [five] members
- 14 expiring January 1 of each even-numbered year. A vacancy on the
- 15 advisory council is filled in the same manner as the original
- 16 appointment for the unexpired term.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2019, the governor
- 18 shall appoint the members of the council as required by Section
- 19 773.012(b)(3), Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, and
- 20 Section 773.012(b)(15), Health and Safety Code, as added by this
- 21 Act.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
