## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to a regenerative medicine registry established by the
- 3 Texas Regenerative Medicine Coordinating Board.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 156, Education Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 156. REGENERATIVE MEDICINE [ADULT STEM CELL RESEARCH]
- 8 PROGRAM
- 9 SECTION 2. Sections 156.001(2) and (4), Education Code, are
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (2) "Consortium" means the Texas Regenerative
- 12 Medicine [Adult Stem Cell Research] Consortium.
- 13 (4) "Program" means the <u>regenerative medicine</u> [adult
- 14 stem cell research] program established under this chapter.
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 156.001(5), Education Code, is
- 16 redesignated as Section 156.001(3-a), Education Code, and amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 <u>(3-a) "Medical</u> [<del>(5) "Research</del>] coordinating board"
- 19 means the Texas Regenerative Medicine [Adult Stem Cell Research]
- 20 Coordinating Board.
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 156.002, Education Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 156.002. COMPOSITION OF MEDICAL [RESEARCH]
- 24 COORDINATING BOARD. (a) The Texas Regenerative Medicine [Adult

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- 1 Stem Cell Research] Coordinating Board is composed of seven members
- 2 appointed as follows:
- 3 (1) three members who are interested persons,
- 4 including at least one person who represents an institution of
- 5 higher education and one person who is a representative of an
- 6 advocacy organization representing patients, appointed by the
- 7 governor, with the advice and consent of the senate;
- 8 (2) two members who are interested persons appointed
- 9 by the lieutenant governor; and
- 10 (3) two members who are interested persons appointed
- 11 by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- 12 (b) The governor shall designate as the presiding officer of
- 13 the medical [research] coordinating board a board member appointed
- 14 under Subsection (a)(1) who represents an institution of higher
- 15 education. The presiding officer serves in that capacity at the
- 16 will of the governor.
- 17 (c) The members of the medical [research] coordinating
- 18 board serve staggered six-year terms. If a vacancy occurs on the
- 19 board, the appropriate appointing authority shall appoint, in the
- 20 same manner as the original appointment, another person to serve
- 21 for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- SECTION 5. Sections 156.003(b) and (c), Education Code, are
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- (b) A person may not be a member of the medical [research]
- 25 coordinating board if:
- 26 (1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid
- 27 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of medicine;

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- 1 (2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid
- 2 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of medicine; or
- 3 (3) the person is a member of the Texas Higher
- 4 Education Coordinating Board.
- 5 (c) A person may not be a member of the medical [research]
- 6 coordinating board if the person is required to register as a
- 7 lobbyist under Chapter 305, Government Code, because of the
- 8 person's activities for compensation on behalf of a profession
- 9 related to the operation of the board.
- SECTION 6. Section 156.004(a), Education Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (a) The medical [research] coordinating board shall
- 13 establish the Texas Regenerative Medicine [Adult Stem Cell
- 14 Research] Consortium.
- 15 SECTION 7. Section 156.005, Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 156.005. ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM; GUIDELINES AND
- 18 PROCEDURES. (a) The medical [research] coordinating board shall
- 19 administer the program to:
- 20 (1) make grants and loans to consortium members for:
- 21 (A) adult stem cell research projects, including
- 22 projects to develop therapies, protocols, or medical procedures
- 23 involving adult stem cells;
- 24 (B) the development of facilities to be used
- 25 solely for adult stem cell research projects; and
- 26 (C) the commercialization of products or
- 27 technology involving adult stem cell research and treatments;

- 1 (2) support consortium members in all stages of the
- 2 process of developing treatments and cures based on adult stem cell
- 3 research, beginning with initial laboratory research through
- 4 successful clinical trials;
- 5 (3) establish appropriate regulatory standards and
- 6 oversight bodies for:
- 7 (A) adult stem cell research conducted by
- 8 consortium members; and
- 9 (B) the development of facilities for consortium
- 10 members conducting adult stem cell research; and
- 11 (4) assist consortium members in applying for grants
- 12 or loans under the program.
- 13 (b) The medical [research] coordinating board shall develop
- 14 research priorities, guidelines, and procedures for providing
- 15 grants and loans for specific research projects conducted by
- 16 consortium members. The priorities, guidelines, and procedures
- 17 must require the grants and loans to be made on a competitive, peer
- 18 review basis.
- 19 SECTION 8. Chapter 156, Education Code, is amended by
- 20 adding Section 156.0055 to read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 156.0055. REGENERATIVE MEDICINE REGISTRY;
- 22 ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. (a) The medical coordinating board shall
- 23 <u>establish and maintain a regenerative medicine registry that lists</u>
- 24 health care providers who provide regenerative therapy using stem
- 25 cells.
- 26 (b) The Department of State Health Services shall provide
- 27 administrative support and services to the medical coordinating

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- 1 board as necessary for the board to establish and operate the
- 2 regenerative medicine registry.
- 3 SECTION 9. Section 156.006, Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 156.006. FUNDING. The program shall be funded by
- 6 gifts, grants, and donations described by Section 156.007. Except
- 7 as provided by Section 156.0055, the [The] program may not be funded
- 8 by legislative appropriations.
- 9 SECTION 10. Section 156.008, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 156.008. BIENNIAL REPORT. Not later than September 1
- 12 of each even-numbered year, the medical [research] coordinating
- 13 board shall submit a report of the board's activities and
- 14 recommendations to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 15 and to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the
- 16 house of representatives, and the presiding officer of each
- 17 legislative standing committee or subcommittee with jurisdiction
- 18 over higher education.
- 19 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
