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- 2 relating to the availability on the Internet of personal financial
- 3 statements filed by public officials.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 572.032(a) and (c), Government Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Financial statements filed under this subchapter are
- 8 public records. The commission shall maintain the statements in
- 9 separate alphabetical files and in a manner that is accessible to
- 10 the public during regular office hours <u>and make the statements</u>
- 11 available to the public on the commission's Internet website.
- 12 (c) After the second anniversary of the date the individual
- 13 ceases to be a state officer, the commission may and on notification
- 14 from the former state officer shall:
- 15 <u>(1)</u> destroy each financial statement filed by the
- 16 state officer; and
- 17 (2) remove each financial statement filed by the state
- 18 officer from the commission's Internet website.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 572.032(a-1), Government Code, as
- 20 amended by Chapters 34 (S.B. 1576) and 983 (H.B. 776), Acts of the
- 21 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (a-1) The commission shall remove the home address, the
- 24 telephone number, and the names of the dependent children of an

- 1 individual from a financial statement filed by the individual under
- 2 this subchapter before:
- 3 (1) permitting a member of the public to view the
- 4 statement;
- 5 (2) providing a copy of the statement to a member of
- 6 the public; or
- 7 (3) making the statement available to the public on
- 8 the commission's Internet website[, if the commission makes
- 9 statements filed under this subchapter available on its website].
- 10 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 11 of this Act, the Texas Ethics Commission shall make the financial
- 12 statements filed under Subchapter B, Chapter 572, Government Code,
- 13 available on the commission's Internet website, as provided by the
- 14 changes in law made by this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
