Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by 6 7 adding Subsection (b-2) to read as follows: (b-2) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), (b-1), or any other 8 9 law, and to the extent consistent with federal law, the parent of or person standing in parental relation to a significantly cognitively 10 11 disabled student may request that the student be exempted from the 12 administration of an alternative assessment instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (b) or (b-1). If a parent or person 13 14 standing in parental relation makes a request for exemption under this subsection, the student's admission, review, and dismissal 15 16 committee, in consultation with the parent or person standing in parental relation, shall determine: 17 18 (1) if the student should be exempted from administration of the alternative assessment instrument; and 19 (2) if the student is exempted from administration of 20 21 the alternative assessment instrument, whether another appropriate method to assess the student's progress is available. 22 23 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2020, the Texas Education Agency shall apply to the United States Department of 24

1 Education for a waiver of the annual alternate assessment of 2 students with significant cognitive disabilities required under 3 the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) and 4 the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 5 1400 et seq.).

6 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020 7 school year.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
