- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Chapter 91B to read as follows:
- 9 CHAPTER 91B. LIABILITY OF VOLUNTEER VETERINARY PRACTITIONERS
- 10 Sec. 91B.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter, "certified
- 11 veterinary assistant," "licensed veterinary technician," and
- 12 "veterinarian" have the meanings assigned by Section 801.002,
- 13 Occupations Code.
- 14 Sec. 91B.002. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY. (a) Except as
- 15 provided by Section 91B.003, a certified veterinary assistant,
- 16 licensed veterinary technician, or veterinarian who in good faith
- 17 and as a volunteer provides medical assistance to an injured animal
- 18 is immune from civil liability for an act or omission that occurs in
- 19 providing that medical assistance if the medical assistance is
- 20 provided:
- 21 (1) in response to an incident that is a man-made or
- 22 <u>natural disaster that injures, endangers, or threatens to endanger</u>
- 23 the animal;
- 24 (2) at the request of the owner of the animal or an

- 1 authorized representative of a local, state, or federal agency,
- 2 including a fire department, a police department, an emergency
- 3 management agency, or a disaster response agency; and
- 4 (3) within the scope of practice authorized and level
- 5 of supervision required under Chapter 801, Occupations Code.
- 6 (b) This section does not apply to a certified veterinary
- 7 assistant, licensed veterinary technician, or veterinarian giving
- 8 medical assistance for or in expectation of compensation from or on
- 9 behalf of the owner of the animal in excess of reimbursement for
- 10 <u>expenses incurred</u>.
- Sec. 91B.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter does not apply
- 12 to an act or omission that is grossly negligent or intentional
- 13 misconduct.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 91B, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 15 as added by this Act, does not apply to a cause of action that
- 16 accrued before the effective date of this Act. A cause of action
- 17 that accrued before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 18 the law applicable to the cause of action immediately before the
- 19 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 20 that purpose.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
