- 5 SECTION 1. Section 122.022(a), Human Resources Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The [On or before November 1 of each year, the]
- 8 workforce commission shall <u>include</u> in the commission's annual
- 9 report to the governor and the legislature under Section 301.065,
- 10 Labor Code, a [prepare an annual] financial report in the form
- 11 prescribed by Section 2101.011, Government Code, relating to the

- 13 report with the governor and the presiding officer of each house of
- 14 the legislature].
- SECTION 2. Section 302.0031(g), Labor Code, is amended to

- 11 report regarding the grant program established under this chapter.
- 12 The report shall include for the period covered by the report:
- 13 (1) the number of students who received grants under
- 14 this chapter; and
- 15 (2) the number of those students who attended each
- 16 eligible institution, including information on the race or
- 17 ethnicity of those students attending each institution.
