- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 140, Local Government Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 140.012 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 140.012. CONTINGENT FEE CONTRACT APPROVAL REQUIRED FOR
- 8 PUBLIC AGENCIES. (a) A public agency as defined by Section 30.003,
- 9 Water Code, may not enter into a contract described by Subchapter C,
- 10 Chapter 2254, Government Code, without review and approval by the
- 11 attorney general.

- 12 (b) This section does not apply to:
- 13 (1) a contract to collect delinquent ad valorem taxes
- 14 under Section 6.30, Tax Code, or Subchapter C, Chapter 33, Tax Code;
- 15 (2) a contract to collect delinquent court fines and
- 16 fees under Article 103.0031, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 17 (3) a contract to collect delinquent accounts
- 18 receivable, including weed liens and paving liens, or other special
- 19 assessments; or
- 20 (4) a type of contract designated by the attorney
- 21 general by rule based on the insignificance of the risk involved or

- 1 to a contract submitted for review and approval on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act. A contract submitted before the
- 3 effective date of this Act is governed by the law as it existed
- 4 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 5 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
