- 21 PREVENTION. (a) A health care facility shall require each health

- course approved by the commission on identifying and assisting 24

- 2 (b) The executive commissioner shall approve and make

- 17 Sec. 116.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

- 20 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 21 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 22 (3) "Health care practitioner" means an individual who
- 23 holds a license, certificate, permit, or other authorization issued
- 24 under this title to engage in a health care profession.
- Sec. 116.002. REQUIRED TRAINING COURSE ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING
- 26 PREVENTION. (a) A health care practitioner and each employee of
- 27 the practitioner within the time prescribed by commission rule

- 1 shall successfully complete a training course approved by the
- 2 commission on identifying and assisting victims of human
- 3 trafficking.
- 4 (b) The executive commissioner shall approve and make
- 5 available to each health care practitioner a training course on
- 6 human trafficking prevention that uses the standardized curriculum
- 7 <u>created by the human trafficking prevention task force under</u>
- 8 Section 402.035(d)(6), Government Code, as that section existed on
- 9 January 1, 2019, or a substantially similar curriculum selected by
- 10 the commission.
- 11 Sec. 116.003. TRAINING REQUIRED FOR LICENSE RENEWAL. A
- 12 health care practitioner shall successfully complete the training
- 13 course described by Section 116.002 as a condition of renewal of a
- 14 license issued to the health care practitioner under this title.
- 15 SECTION 3. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 16 date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 17 Services Commission shall approve and make available the required
- 18 human trafficking prevention training course and adopt rules
- 19 necessary to implement Chapter 226, Health and Safety Code, and
- 20 Chapter 116, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 21 (b) Notwithstanding Section 226.002, Health and Safety
- 22 Code, and Section 116.002, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, a
- 23 health care facility or health care practitioner is not required to
- 24 comply with those sections before September 1, 2020.
- 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
