3 (7) is the primary caretaker of a person who is unable4 to care for himself or herself;

5 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b), is summoned 6 for service in a county with a population of at least 250,000 and 7 the person has served as a petit juror in the county during the 8 three-year period preceding the date the person is to appear for 9 jury service; [or]

10 (9) is a member of the United States military forces 11 serving on active duty and deployed to a location away from the 12 person's home station and out of the person's county of residence<u>;</u> 13 or

14 (10) is a documented tribal council member or employee
15 of the legislative branch of tribal government for the
16 Alabama-Coushatta Indian Tribe, the Ysleta del Sur Pueblo (Tigua
17 Indian Tribe), or the Kickapoo Traditional Tribe of Texas.

18 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to a person summoned to 19 appear for jury service who is required to appear on or after the 20 effective date of this Act. A person summoned to appear for jury 21 service who is required to appear before the effective date of this 22 Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the 23 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in 24 effect for that purpose.
