## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the duties of a public school counselor regarding student discipline. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 33.006, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 6 7 follows: In addition to a school counselor's responsibility 8 (b) 9 under Subsection (a), the school counselor shall: 10 (1) participate in planning, implementing, and evaluating a comprehensive developmental guidance program to serve 11 12 all students and to address the special needs of students: 13 (A) who are at risk of dropping out of school, 14 becoming substance abusers, participating in gang activity, or committing suicide; 15 who are in need of modified instructional 16 (B) 17 strategies; or 18 (C) who are gifted and talented, with emphasis on identifying and serving gifted and talented students who are 19 20 educationally disadvantaged; 21 (2) consult with a student's parent or guardian and 22 make referrals as appropriate in consultation with the student's 23 parent or guardian; 24 (3) consult with school staff, parents, and other

No. 2074 1 community members to help them increase the effectiveness of student education and promote student success; 2 3 (4) coordinate people and resources in the school, home, and community; 4 5 (5) with the assistance of school staff, interpret standardized test results and other assessment data that help a 6 student make educational and career plans; 7 8 (6) deliver classroom guidance activities or serve as a consultant to teachers conducting lessons based on the school's 9 10 guidance curriculum; [and] serve as an impartial, nonreporting resource for 11 (7) 12 interpersonal conflicts and discord involving two or more students, including accusations of bullying under Section 37.0832; 13 14 (8) serve on a placement review committee under 15 Section 37.003; 16 (9) assist with a student placed into a disciplinary 17 alternative education program as provided by Section 37.008; and (10) serve on a committee to review a student's 18 19 placement in an alternative education program under Section 37.306. (d) A school counselor may not be required to assume a 20 disciplinary role at a school, or to otherwise be assigned a duty 21 involving student discipline that is inconsistent with the 22 counselor's primary responsibility under Subsection (a) 23 and 24 additional responsibilities under this section. 3	SECTION 2. Section 37.008, Education Code, is amended by

10	(2) is located on or off of a regular school campus;

2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
