A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain activities near a polling place; changing the 3 elements of certain criminal offenses. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.003(a), Election Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 A person commits an offense if, during the voting period 7 (a) and within 300 [100] feet of an outside door through which a voter 8 9 may enter the building in which a polling place is located, the 10 person: 11 (1)loiters; or 12 (2) electioneers for or against any candidate, 13 measure, or political party. 14 SECTION 2. Section 61.010(a), Election Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person may not 16 wear a badge, insignia, emblem, or other similar communicative 17 device relating to a candidate, measure, or political party 18 appearing on the ballot, or to the conduct of the election, in the 19 polling place or within 300 [100] feet of any outside door through 20 21 which a voter may enter the building in which the polling place is 22 located. SECTION 3. Sections 62.013(a) and (b), Election Code, are 23 24 amended to read as follows:

(a) An election officer commits an offense if the officer
knowingly posts at a polling place, including the area within <u>300</u>
[100] feet of an outside door through which a voter may enter the
building in which the polling place is located, a sign, card,
poster, or other similar material that:

is not authorized or required by law; or

7 (2) is in a form or contains information that is not8 authorized or required by law.

9 (b) A person other than an election officer commits an 10 offense if the person posts a sign, card, poster, or other similar 11 material at a polling place, including the <u>300-foot</u> [100-foot] area 12 described by Subsection (a).

SECTION 4. Section 85.036(a), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) During the time an early voting polling place is open for the conduct of early voting, a person may not electioneer for or against any candidate, measure, or political party in or within <u>300</u> [100] feet of an outside door through which a voter may enter the building or structure in which the early voting polling place is located.

SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
