A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a commission to study the needs of areas of the state
- 3 significantly affected by oil and gas production.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "commission" means the
- 6 generate recurring oil wealth for Texas (GROW Texas) study
- 7 commission.
- 8 (b) The generate recurring oil wealth for Texas (GROW Texas)
- 9 study commission is established to study the needs of areas of the
- 10 state significantly affected by oil and gas production, including
- 11 infrastructure, safety, and educational needs, and to make
- 12 recommendations to the legislature regarding the appropriation of
- 13 money in the generate recurring oil wealth for Texas (GROW Texas)
- 14 fund created under Section 49-g-3, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 15 (c) The commission is composed of seven members, consisting
- 16 of the following:
- 17 (1) three members appointed by the governor;
- 18 (2) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 19 and
- 20 (3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 21 of representatives.
- 22 (d) The members appointed by the governor must reside in
- 23 areas of the state from which oil and gas are produced and include
- 24 at least:

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- 1 (1) one person who is a member of the business
- 2 community; and
- 3 (2) one person who is a member of the civic community.
- 4 (e) At least one member appointed by the lieutenant governor
- 5 and one member appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 6 representatives must represent an area of the state from which oil
- 7 and gas are produced.
- 8 (f) In making appointments under this section, the
- 9 governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of
- 10 representatives shall coordinate to ensure that the membership of
- 11 the commission reflects, to the extent possible, the ethnic and
- 12 geographic diversity of the state.
- 13 (g) The governor shall designate the presiding officer of
- 14 the commission.
- 15 (h) A member of the commission is not entitled to
- 16 compensation for service on the commission but is entitled to
- 17 reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 18 performing commission duties.
- 19 (i) The commission shall develop recommendations under this
- 20 section to address issues related to:
- 21 (1) the specific needs of areas of the state from which
- 22 oil and gas are produced, including:
- 23 (A) needs relating to infrastructure degradation
- 24 caused by oil and gas production activities;
- 25 (B) increased public health and safety needs; and
- 26 (C) educational and workforce training needs;
- 27 and

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- 1 (2) the costs to political subdivisions to address the
- 2 needs identified under Subdivision (1) of this subsection.
- 3 (j) Not later than December 31, 2020, the commission shall
- 4 prepare and deliver a report to the governor and the legislature
- 5 that recommends statutory changes to address the needs of areas of
- 6 the state significantly affected by oil and gas production and the
- 7 appropriation of state funds dedicated for those purposes.
- 8 (k) The commission may hold public meetings as needed to
- 9 fulfill its duties under this section.
- 10 (1) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552,
- 11 Government Code.
- 12 (m) The commission is abolished and this section expires
- 13 February 1, 2021.
- 14 SECTION 2. Not later than the 30th day after the effective
- 15 date of this Act, the appropriate persons shall make the
- 16 appointments and designation required by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2020, but only
- 18 if the constitutional amendment proposed by the 86th Legislature,
- 19 Regular Session, 2019, providing for the creation of the generate
- 20 recurring oil wealth for Texas (GROW Texas) fund, dedicating the
- 21 money in that fund to benefit areas of the state from which oil and
- 22 gas are produced, and providing for the transfer of certain general
- 23 revenues to that fund, the economic stabilization fund, and the
- 24 state highway fund is approved by the voters. If that amendment is
- 25 not approved by the voters, this Act has no effect.
