8	(a) A boat may not be used for the purpose of catching,
9	storing, and transporting menhaden in tidal water unless the owner
10	of the boat has acquired <u>:</u>
11	(1) a Class A menhaden boat license; or
12	(2) a Class C menhaden boat license.
13	(a-1) The holder of a Class C menhaden boat license may not
14	take or harvest from the public water of the state more than 300
15	pounds a day of menhaden or an amount set by the department.
16	(d) The commission shall set the license fee for each [ <del>Class</del>
17	${f B}$ ] menhaden boat for each yearly period:
18	(1) in an amount <u>not less than \$2,000 for a Class A</u>
19	menhaden boat license;
20	(2) in an amount not to exceed \$50 for a Class B
21	menhaden boat license; and
22	(3) at \$420 for a Class C menhaden boat license.
23	SECTION 2. Section 47.038, Parks and Wildlife Code, is

read as follows: 1 Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), nets [Nets] or 2 (a) purse seines used for catching menhaden may not be: 3 4 (1) less than one and one-half inch stretched mesh, 5 excluding the bag; 6 (2) used in any bay, river, pass, or tributary, nor within one mile of any barrier, jetty, island, or pass, nor within 7 8 one-half mile offshore in the Gulf of Mexico; or (3) used for the purpose of taking edible aquatic 9 products for the purpose of barter, sale, or exchange. 10 (a-1) The holder of a Class C menhaden boat license issued 11 under Section 47.008 may use a cast net, as defined by the 12 commission, to catch menhaden. 13 SECTION 3. Section 47.008(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 14 15 repealed. 16 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
