1	AN ACT
2	relating to the operation of public transit vehicles equipped with
3	connected braking systems.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 545.0621 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 545.0621. FOLLOWING DISTANCE FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC
8	TRANSIT VEHICLES. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Automated motor vehicle" has the meaning assigned
10	by Section 545.451.
11	(2) "Connected braking system" has the meaning
12	assigned by Section 545.062(d).
13	(3) "Public transit vehicle" means a bus or other
14	vehicle, including an automated motor vehicle, used to provide
15	transit services to the public by:
16	(A) a political subdivision of this state; or
17	(B) a private entity operating under a contract
18	with a political subdivision of this state.
19	(b) Sections 545.062(b), (c), and (d) do not apply to an
20	operator of a public transit vehicle that is following one or more
21	other public transit vehicles if:
22	(1) the vehicles are equipped with a connected braking

(2) the speed of each vehicle is automatically

- 1 coordinated through the connected braking system.
- 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter J, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
- 3 is amended by adding Section 545.457 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 545.457. FOLLOWING DISTANCE FOR CERTAIN AUTOMATED
- 5 MOTOR VEHICLES. (a) In this section:
- 6 (1) "Connected braking system" has the meaning
- 7 assigned by Section 545.062(d).
- 8 (2) "Public transit vehicle" has the meaning assigned
- 9 by Section 545.0621.
- 10 (b) This section applies only to an automated motor vehicle
- 11 that is a public transit vehicle.
- 12 (c) Notwithstanding Section 545.062, an automated motor
- 13 vehicle equipped with a connected braking system that is following
- 14 another automated motor vehicle equipped with that system may be
- 15 assisted by the system to maintain any desired distance between the
- 16 vehicles.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
