A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the prescribing and ordering of Schedule II controlled substances by certain advanced practice registered nurses and 3 physician assistants. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Sections 157.0511(a) and (b), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 7 A physician's authority to delegate the prescribing or 8 (a) ordering of a drug or device under this subchapter is limited to: 9 10 nonprescription drugs; 11 (2) dangerous drugs; and 12 (3) controlled substances to the extent provided by Subsection [Subsections] (b) [and (b-1)]. 13 14 A [Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), a] physician (b) may delegate the prescribing or ordering of a controlled substance 15 only if: 16 (1) the prescription is for a controlled substance 17 listed in Schedule <u>II,</u> III, IV, or V as established by the 18 commissioner of state health services [the Department of State 19 Health Services] under Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code; 20 21 (2) the prescription, including any [a] refill of the prescription, is for a period not to exceed 90 days; 22 23 (3) with regard to the refill of a prescription, the 24 refill is authorized after consultation with the delegating

No. 2250 physician and the consultation is noted in the patient's chart; and 1 2 (4) with regard to a prescription for a child less than 3 two years of age, the prescription is made after consultation with 4 the delegating physician and the consultation is noted in the 5 patient's chart. SECTION 2. Section 157.0511(b-1), Occupations Code, 6 is 7 repealed.

8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
