## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a study by the Texas A&M Transportation Institute on the
- 3 collection of road use fees from owners of alternatively fueled
- 4 vehicles.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 7 (1) "Alternatively fueled vehicle" means a motor
- 8 vehicle that is capable of using a fuel other than gasoline or
- 9 conventional diesel fuel.
- 10 (2) "Traditionally fueled vehicle" means a motor
- 11 vehicle that uses gasoline or conventional diesel fuel as its
- 12 source of motor power.
- 13 SECTION 2. STUDY AND REPORT. (a) The Texas A&M
- 14 Transportation Institute shall conduct a study on:
- 15 (1) the impacts of the alternatively fueled vehicle
- 16 industry on this state; and
- 17 (2) the options available to the state for collecting
- 18 road use fees from owners of alternatively fueled vehicles.
- 19 (b) The study must examine:
- 20 (1) the current revenue generated from motor fuel
- 21 taxes imposed under Chapter 162, Tax Code, on a traditionally
- 22 fueled vehicle for each mile the vehicle is operated;
- 23 (2) the net revenue generated by fees and taxes paid by
- 24 owners of alternatively fueled vehicles and traditionally fueled

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- 1 vehicles for the use of the vehicle, including motor vehicle
- 2 registration fees under Chapter 502, Transportation Code, and motor
- 3 fuel taxes under Chapter 162, Tax Code;
- 4 (3) the average number of miles traveled by
- 5 alternatively fueled vehicles and traditionally fueled vehicles
- 6 each year;
- 7 (4) the methods by which other states generate revenue
- 8 from alternatively fueled vehicles;
- 9 (5) alternative methods for determining and
- 10 collecting road use fees from owners of alternatively fueled
- 11 vehicles, including methods that consider the weight of and the
- 12 number of miles traveled by an alternatively fueled vehicle;
- 13 (6) the projected revenue to the state for each method
- 14 examined under Subdivision (5) of this subsection; and
- 15 (7) the projected environmental impact of
- 16 alternatively fueled vehicles on this state.
- 17 (c) Not later than December 1, 2020, the Texas A&M
- 18 Transportation Institute shall submit to the legislature a report
- 19 on the findings of the study conducted under this section.
- SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires January 1, 2021.
- 21 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 22 1, 2019.
