## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to newborn and infant hearing screening results and the
- 3 provision of information following a screening.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 47.0031(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) If a newborn or an infant does not pass the screening in
- 8 a follow-up hearing screening, the program that performed the
- 9 follow-up hearing screening on the newborn or infant shall:
- 10 (1) provide the screening results to:
- 11 (A) the newborn's or infant's parents [with the
- 12 screening results]; and
- 13 (B) with the prior written consent of the
- 14 newborn's or infant's parents, the primary statewide resource
- 15 center established under Section 30.051, Education Code;
- 16 (2) assist in scheduling a diagnostic audiological
- 17 evaluation for the newborn or infant, consistent with the most
- 18 current guidelines in the Joint Committee on Infant Hearing
- 19 Position Statement, or refer the newborn or infant to a licensed
- 20 audiologist who provides diagnostic audiological evaluations for
- 21 newborns or infants that are consistent with the most current
- 22 guidelines in the Joint Committee on Infant Hearing Position
- 23 Statement; and
- 24 (3) refer the newborn or infant to early childhood

- 1 intervention services and the primary statewide resource center
- 2 established under Section 30.051, Education Code.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 47.005, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection
- 5 (a-1) to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A birthing facility that operates a program shall
- 7 <u>simultaneously</u> distribute to the parents of each newborn or infant
- 8 who is screened:
- 9 (1) the screening results;
- 10 (2) educational <u>and informational</u> materials that are
- 11 standardized by the department regarding:
- 12 (A) [screening results and] follow-up care; and
- 13 (B) available public resources, including:
- 14 <u>(i) early childhood intervention services</u>
- 15 <u>developed under Chapter 73</u>, Human Resources Code;
- 16 <u>(ii)</u> the primary statewide resource center
- 17 established under Section 30.051, Education Code; and
- 18 (iii) contact information for Texas Early
- 19 Hearing Detection and Intervention.
- 20 (a-1) The department shall make available to the public on
- 21 request the educational and informational materials described by
- 22 Subsection (a)(2).
- 23 (b) A birthing facility that operates a program shall report
- 24 screening results to:
- 25 (1) the parents;
- 26 (2) the newborn's or infant's attending physician,
- 27 primary care physician, or other applicable health care provider;

- 2 (3) the department; and
- 3 (4) the primary statewide resource center established
- 4 under Section 30.051, Education Code.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 47.008(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) The executive commissioner by rule shall develop
- 8 guidelines to protect the confidentiality of patients in accordance
- 9 with Chapter 159, Occupations Code, and require the written consent
- 10 of a parent or guardian of a patient before any individually
- 11 identifying information is provided to the department or the
- 12 primary statewide resource center established under Section
- 13 <u>30.051</u>, Education Code, as set out in this chapter. The department
- 14 and center shall permit a parent or guardian at any time to withdraw
- 15 information provided to the department or center under this
- 16 chapter.
- 17 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 18 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 19 Services Commission shall adopt rules as necessary to implement the
- 20 changes in law made by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
