2	relating to administrative penalties assessed against certain
3	nursing facilities for the improper discharge or transfer of a

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 242, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 242.0661 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 242.0661. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY FOR IMPROPER
9	DISCHARGE OR TRANSFER OF RESIDENT. (a) The commission shall assess
10	an administrative penalty under this section against a
11	Medicaid-certified nursing facility that discharges or transfers a
12	resident from the facility in violation of:
13	(1) a rule related to the improper discharge or
14	transfer of a resident from a facility or to the return of a
15	resident to a facility following hospitalization; or
16	(2) a hearing officer's fair hearing decision.
17	(b) A penalty described by Subsection (a) must be assessed
18	in the following graduated amounts:
19	(1) \$2,000 for each day of a continuing violation
20	during the first seven consecutive days;
21	(2) \$4,000 for each day of a continuing violation

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(3) \$6,000 for each day of a continuing violation

during the second seven consecutive days; and

after the first 14 consecutive days.

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- 1 (c) For purposes of assessing a violation under this
- 2 section, the first day of a violation is the date the violation is
- 3 cited at an exit conference following a survey, inspection, or
- 4 investigation.
- 5 (d) Section 242.0665 does not apply to a penalty assessed
- 6 under Subsection (b)(2) or (3).
- 7 (e) The commission shall order a nursing facility that is
- 8 assessed a penalty under Subsection (b)(3) to immediately suspend
- 9 admissions until the facility corrects the violation or complies
- 10 with a hearing officer's fair hearing decision regarding the
- 11 <u>discharged or transferred resident.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 242.0661, Health and Safety Code, as
- 13 added by this Act, applies only to actions taken by the Health and
- 14 Human Services Commission and license holders under Chapter 242,
- 15 Health and Safety Code, on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
