5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 151, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 151.0521 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 151.0521. EXEMPTION FOR SPORTS TEAM PHYSICIAN. A
8	person is exempt from the licensing requirements of this subtitle
9	and may engage in the practice of medicine in this state if the
10	person:
11	(1) is employed or designated as a team physician by a
12	sports team visiting this state for a specific sporting event;
13	(2) is licensed to practice medicine in the team's home
14	state; and
15	(3) limits the person's practice of medicine in this
16	state to treating, during the period beginning on the date the team
17	arrives in this state for the event and ending on the date the team
18	leaves this state:
19	(A) the members, coaches, and staff of the team;
20	and
21	(B) a family member of a person described by
22	Paragraph (A) if the family member is visiting this state for the
23	event.
24	SECTION 2. Section 451.003, Occupations Code, is amended to

This chapter does not apply 3 to: 4 a physician licensed by the Texas Medical Board or (1)5 engaged in the practice of medicine as authorized by Section 6 151.0521; a dentist, licensed under the laws of this state, 7 (2) 8 engaged in the practice of dentistry; 9 (3) a licensed optometrist or therapeutic optometrist 10 engaged in the practice of optometry or therapeutic optometry as defined by statute; 11 12 (4) an occupational therapist engaged in the practice of occupational therapy; 13 14 (5) a nurse engaged in the practice of nursing; 15 (6) a licensed podiatrist engaged in the practice of podiatry as defined by statute; 16 17 (7) a physical therapist engaged in the practice of physical therapy; 18 (8) a registered massage therapist engaged in the 19 practice of massage therapy; 20 (9) a commissioned or contract physician, physical 21 therapist, or physical therapist assistant in the United States 22 Army, Navy, Air Force, or Public Health Service; or 23 24 (10) an athletic trainer who does not live in this 25 state, who is licensed, registered, or certified by an authority 26 recognized by the department, and who provides athletic training in this state for a period determined by the department. 27
