A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to a work group on enhancing the training and
- 3 credentialing of emergency management personnel.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Disaster" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 7 418.004, Government Code.
- 8 (2) "Emergency management director" and "emergency
- 9 management coordinator" mean the director and coordinator,
- 10 respectively, designated under Section 418.1015, Government Code.
- 11 (3) "Work group" means the work group established
- 12 under Section 2 of this Act.
- SECTION 2. WORK GROUP. The Texas Division of Emergency
- 14 Management shall establish a work group of persons knowledgeable on
- 15 emergency management to study and develop a proposal for enhancing
- 16 the training and credentialing of emergency management directors,
- 17 emergency management coordinators, and other emergency management
- 18 personnel on the state or local level.
- 19 SECTION 3. STUDY AND PROPOSAL. (a) As part of the study and
- 20 proposal under Section 2 of this Act, the work group shall:
- 21 (1) assess the training and credentials necessary for
- 22 emergency management directors, emergency management coordinators,
- 23 and other emergency management personnel on the state or local
- 24 level to effectively oversee the response to and recovery from a

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- 1 disaster, including reviewing current required training courses;
- 2 and
- 3 (2) consult with institutions of higher education, as
- 4 defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, on the development of
- 5 degree programs in emergency management in addition to the programs
- 6 that exist in this state on the effective date of this Act.
- 7 (b) In conducting the assessment required by Subsection
- 8 (a)(1) of this section, the work group shall consider:
- 9 (1) whether the differences in geography, population,
- 10 and critical infrastructure between emergency management
- 11 directors' or emergency management coordinators' jurisdictions
- 12 warrant different levels of training and credentialing;
- 13 (2) whether the legislature should enact laws
- 14 requiring an emergency management director or emergency management
- 15 coordinator to participate in emergency management training and
- 16 credentialing before overseeing the response to and recovery from a
- 17 disaster;
- 18 (3) whether to include in any training required under
- 19 Subdivision (2) of this subsection information on disaster finance,
- 20 damage assessment, disaster contracting, debris management, and
- 21 skills needed to participate in federal emergency management
- 22 programs;
- 23 (4) whether to implement incentives for emergency
- 24 management directors, emergency management coordinators, and any
- 25 other emergency management personnel to complete additional
- 26 training and continuing education; and
- 27 (5) proposals for paying the cost for training for

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- 1 emergency management directors and emergency management
- 2 coordinators that is more rigorous than the training required by
- 3 law for the directors and coordinators on the effective date of this
- 4 Act.
- 5 (c) Not later than November 1, 2020, the work group shall
- 6 submit the proposal required under this section to:
- 7 (1) members of the legislature; and
- 8 (2) the governor.
- 9 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. The work group is abolished and this
- 10 Act expires January 1, 2021.
- SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 12 1, 2019.
