- 2 relating to a Medicaid buy-in program for employees of small

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 531.024442 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 531.024442. MEDICAID BUY-IN PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYEES OF
- 8 SMALL BUSINESSES. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Program participant" means an employee of a small
- 10 business who receives health care services under Medicaid through
- 11 the buy-in program established under this section.
- 12 (2) "Small business" means a business with an annual
- 13 gross revenue of \$850,000 or less.
- 14 (b) The commission shall operate a Medicaid buy-in program
- 15 under which a person who is an employee of a small business may
- 16 receive health care services under Medicaid. The executive
- 17 commissioner shall adopt rules for the program that:
- 18 <u>(1) establish eligibility requirements for</u>
- 19 participation in the program, including household income limits,
- 20 that ensure receipt of federal matching money for providing health
- 21 care services under Medicaid to a program participant;
- 22 (2) require financial participation by the program
- 23 participant, including a requirement that the program participant
- 24 pay, according to a sliding scale based on household income

- 1 determined in accordance with commission rules, a portion of any
- 2 premiums imposed or cost-sharing payments required under the
- 3 program; and
- 4 (3) require financial participation by a small
- 5 business that employs a program participant, including a
- 6 requirement that the small business pay a portion of any premiums
- 7 imposed or cost-sharing payments required under the program, in
- 8 amounts determined in accordance with commission rules.
- 9 (c) The executive commissioner shall ensure that the rules
- 10 adopted under Subsection (b) regarding the financial participation
- 11 required of a small business are not cost prohibitive to
- 12 participation by a small business in the program.
- 13 <u>(d) The program under this section must be substantively</u>
- 14 identical to the Medicaid buy-in programs for persons with
- 15 disabilities established under Section 531.02444, except to the
- 16 extent that programmatic differences are appropriate because of the
- 17 populations served by the programs.
- 18 (e) The commission shall prepare and make available to small
- 19 businesses information concerning the availability of and
- 20 application process for the program under this section. A small
- 21 business may provide that information to its employees and
- 22 prospective employees.
- SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2020, the executive
- 24 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 25 adopt the rules required by Section 531.024442, Government Code, as
- 26 added by this Act, and the commission shall implement the program
- 27 required by that section.

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- 1 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 2 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 3 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 4 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 5 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 6 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
