5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 418.054, 418.055, 418.056, 418.057,
7	418.058, and 418.059 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 418.054. COORDINATING 9-1-1 TEXT MESSAGE CAPABILITY.
9	The division, in consultation with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension
10	Service, shall coordinate state and local government efforts to
11	make 9-1-1 emergency service capable of receiving text messages
12	from a cellular telephone or other wireless communication device.
13	Sec. 418.055. SOCIAL MEDIA USE DURING AND AFTER DISASTERS.
14	The division, in consultation with any state agency or private
15	entity the division determines is appropriate, shall develop
16	standards for the use of social media as a communication tool by
17	governmental entities during and after a disaster. The standards
18	must:
19	(1) require state agencies, political subdivisions,
20	first responders, and volunteers that use social media during and
21	after a disaster to post consistent and clear information;
22	(2) optimize the effectiveness of social media use
23	during and after a disaster; and
24	(3) require that certain official social media

1	accounts be used during and after a disaster only for providing
2	credible sources of information.
3	Sec. 418.056. DISASTER MOBILE APPLICATION. (a) The
4	division shall develop a mobile application for wireless
5	communication devices to communicate critical information during a
6	disaster directly to disaster victims and first responders.
7	(b) The mobile application may provide information on:
8	(1) road and weather conditions during a disaster; and
9	(2) disaster response and recovery activities.
10	Sec. 418.057. DISASTER WEB PORTAL. The division shall
11	develop a comprehensive disaster web portal. The web portal must:
12	(1) provide disaster information to the public,
13	including information on programs and services available to
14	disaster victims and funding for and expenditures of disaster
15	assistance programs;
16	(2) include information on disaster response and
17	recovery activities; and
18	(3) provide information on obtaining assistance from
19	the Federal Emergency Management Agency, state agencies, organized
20	volunteer groups, and any other entities providing disaster
21	assistance.
22	Sec. 418.058. USE OF DATA ANALYTICS IN DISASTER MANAGEMENT.
23	To the extent feasible, the division shall use data analytics
24	software to integrate data from federal, state, local, and
25	nongovernmental sources to more effectively manage disaster
26	response and recovery.
27	Sec. 418.059. STUDY ON STANDARD COMMUNICATION FORMAT. (a)

1	To improve the state's response to disasters, the division shall
2	conduct a study on the use of a standard communication format by
3	first responders to create a common interoperable operating
4	framework during a disaster. The study must:
5	(1) examine the costs and benefits of promoting the
6	use of a standard communication format to create a comprehensive
7	common operating framework that is interoperable across networks;
8	(2) identify any costs that first responders may incur
9	in acquiring or upgrading equipment or services complying with a
10	standard communication format; and
11	(3) identify necessary actions to adopt a standard
12	communication format.
13	(b) Not later than September 1, 2020, the division shall
14	submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the
15	legislature a report on the findings of the study.
16	(c) This section expires December 1, 2020.
17	SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
18	amended by adding Section 418.127 to read as follows:
19	Sec. 418.127. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS COMMUNITY OUTREACH. To
20	the extent practicable, the following entities shall conduct
21	community outreach, including public awareness campaigns, and
22	education activities on disaster preparedness each year:
23	(1) municipalities and counties;
24	(2) the department, including the division;
25	(3) the Texas Education Agency;
26	(4) the office of the comptroller;
27	(5) the Texas Department of Insurance;

1	(6) the Texas Department of Transportation;
2	(7) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
3	Affairs;
4	(8) the Health and Human Services Commission; and
5	(9) the Department of State Health Services.
6	SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Sections 418.193 and 418.194 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 418.193. PURCHASE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COMMODITY
9	ITEMS FOR DISASTER PURPOSES. A public safety entity, as defined by
10	47 U.S.C. Section 1401, or a county hospital, public hospital, or
11	hospital district may purchase commodity items through the
12	Department of Information Resources in accordance with Section
13	2157.068 if the public safety entity, hospital, or hospital
14	district finds that the purchase of those commodity items will
15	assist the public safety entity, hospital, or hospital district in
16	providing disaster education or preparing for a disaster.
17	Sec. 418.194. CONTRACTS WITH CERTAIN ENTITIES FOR DISASTER
18	PURPOSES. (a) In this section, "consolidated telecommunications
19	system" has the meaning assigned by Section 2170.001(a).
20	(b) A public safety entity, as defined by 47 U.S.C. Section
21	1401, or a governmental entity of another state may contract with
22	the Department of Information Resources for use of the consolidated
23	telecommunications system in accordance with Section 2170.004 if
24	the public safety entity or governmental entity finds that the use
25	of the consolidated telecommunications system will assist the
26	entity in providing disaster education or preparing for a disaster.
27	SECTION 4. Section 531.0312(a), Government Code, is amended

1 to read as follows:

2 (a) The Texas Information and Referral Network at the 3 commission is the program responsible for the development, 4 coordination, and implementation of a statewide information and 5 referral network that integrates existing community-based 6 structures with state and local agencies. The network must:

7 (1) include information relating to transportation
8 services provided to clients of state and local agencies;

9 (2) be capable of assisting with statewide disaster 10 response and emergency management, including through the use of 11 interstate agreements with out-of-state call centers to ensure 12 preparedness and responsiveness;

13 (3) include technology capable of communicating with 14 clients of state and local agencies using electronic text 15 messaging; and

16 <u>(4) include a publicly accessible Internet-based</u> 17 system to provide real-time, searchable data about the location and 18 number of clients of state and local agencies using the system and 19 the types of requests made by the clients.

20 SECTION 5. Section 2157.068(j), Government Code, is amended 21 to read as follows:

(j) The following entities may purchase commodity items through the department, and be charged a reasonable administrative fee, as provided by this section:

Section 2170.004, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 Sec. 2170.004. CONTRACTS WITH ENTITIES OTHER THAN STATE 12 AGENCIES. The department may contract for use of the consolidated 13 14 telecommunications system with: 15 (1) each house of the legislature; 16 (2) a legislative agency; 17 (3) an agency that is not a state agency as defined by Section 2151.002; 18 19 (4) a political subdivision, including a county, municipality, or district; 20 21 (5) a private institution of higher education accredited by a recognized accrediting agency, as defined by 22 Section 61.003, Education Code, that: 23 24 (A) engages in distance learning, as defined by 25 Section 57.021, Utilities Code; and receives federal funds for distance learning 26 (B) 27 initiatives; [and]

3	(7) subject to Section 418.194, a public safety

7	SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
