## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 418.054, 418.055, 418.056, 418.057, and
7	418.058 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 418.054. COORDINATING 9-1-1 TEXT MESSAGE CAPABILITY.
9	The division, in consultation with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension
10	Service, shall coordinate state and local government efforts to
11	make 9-1-1 emergency service capable of receiving text messages
12	from a cellular telephone or other wireless communication device.
13	Sec. 418.055. SOCIAL MEDIA USE DURING AND AFTER DISASTERS.
14	The division, in consultation with the Texas A&M Engineering
15	Extension Service and other appropriate public and private
16	entities, shall develop standards for the use of social media as a
17	communication tool by governmental entities during and after a
18	disaster. The standards must:
19	(1) require state agencies, political subdivisions,
20	first responders, and volunteers that use social media during and
21	after a disaster to post consistent and clear information;
22	(2) optimize the effectiveness of social media use
23	during and after a disaster; and
24	(3) require certain official social media accounts be

- 1 used during and after a disaster only for providing credible
- 2 sources of information.
- 3 Sec. 418.056. DISASTER MOBILE APPLICATION. (a) The
- 4 division, in consultation with the Texas A&M Forest Service, shall
- 5 develop a mobile application for wireless communication devices to
- 6 <u>communicate critical information during a disaster directly to</u>
- 7 disaster victims and first responders.
- 8 (b) The mobile application may provide information on:
- 9 (1) road and weather conditions during a disaster; and
- 10 (2) disaster response and recovery activities.
- 11 Sec. 418.057. USE OF DATA ANALYTICS IN DISASTER MANAGEMENT.
- 12 To the extent feasible, the division shall use data analytics
- 13 software to integrate data from federal, state, local, and
- 14 nongovernmental sources to more effectively manage disaster
- 15 <u>response and recovery.</u>
- Sec. 418.058. STUDY ON STANDARD COMMUNICATION FORMAT. (a)
- 17 To improve the state's response to disasters, the division, in
- 18 consultation with the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service,
- 19 shall conduct a study on the use of a standard communication format
- 20 by first responders to create a common operating framework during a
- 21 disaster. The study must:
- 22 (1) examine the costs and benefits of promoting the
- 23 use of a standard communication format to create a single
- 24 comprehensive common operating framework;
- 25 (2) identify any costs that first responders may incur
- 26 in acquiring equipment complying with a standard communication
- 27 format; and

1 (3) identify necessary actions to adopt a standard 2 communication format. (b) Not later than September 1, 2020, the division shall 3 submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the 4 5 legislature a report on the findings of the study. 6 (c) This section expires December 1, 2020. 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 418, Government Code, is 8 amended by adding Section 418.127 to read as follows: Sec. 418.127. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS COMMUNITY OUTREACH. To 9 the extent practicable, the following entities shall conduct 10 community outreach, including public awareness campaigns, and 11 12 education activities on disaster preparedness each year: (1) municipalities and counties; 13 14 (2) the division; 15 (3) the Texas Education Agency; (4) the office of the comptroller; 16 17 (5) the Texas Department of Insurance; (6) the Texas Department of Transportation; 18 19 (7) the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs; and 20 21 (8) the Department of State Health Services. SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 418, Government Code, is 22 23 amended by adding Section 418.193 to read as follows: 24 Sec. 418.193. DISASTER WEB PORTAL. The Texas A&M

University System, in coordination with the governor and the

division, shall develop a comprehensive disaster web portal.

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web portal must:

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- 1 (1) provide disaster information to the public,
- 2 including information on programs and services available to
- 3 disaster victims and funding for and expenditures of disaster
- 4 <u>assistance programs;</u>
- 5 (2) include information on disaster response and
- 6 recovery activities; and
- 7 (3) provide information on obtaining assistance from
- 8 the Federal Emergency Management Agency, state agencies, organized
- 9 volunteer groups, and any other entities providing disaster
- 10 <u>assistance.</u>
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
