A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study of an intake system and state case management
- 3 system for state and federal disaster assistance.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section:
- 6 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 7 Commission.
- 8 (2) "Division" means the Texas Division of Emergency
- 9 Management.
- 10 (b) The commission and the division shall conduct a study to
- 11 determine the feasibility of developing:
- 12 (1) a single intake form that would compile all
- 13 information needed to obtain disaster assistance from multiple
- 14 state and federal programs for an individual who needs assistance
- 15 as a result of a disaster;
- 16 (2) an automated intake system for collecting the
- 17 information; and
- 18 (3) a state case management system for disaster
- 19 assistance, administered by the commission, that is similar to the
- 20 Federal Emergency Management Agency case management system and
- 21 includes contracting with nonprofit vendors to hire caseworkers and
- 22 provide case management services.
- 23 (c) The commission and the division shall coordinate with
- 24 the Federal Emergency Management Agency and other appropriate state

- 1 and federal agencies to conduct the study under Subsection (b) of
- 2 this section. The commission and the division must determine:
- 3 (1) whether the Federal Emergency Management Agency
- 4 and other appropriate state and federal agencies will accept the
- 5 single intake form;
- 6 (2) the cost of developing the single intake form and
- 7 the cost of developing and maintaining the automated intake system;
- 8 and
- 9 (3) the cost of developing and maintaining a state
- 10 case management system and the extent to which federal
- 11 reimbursement is available.
- 12 (d) Not later than September 1, 2020, the commission and the
- 13 division shall prepare and submit a written report to the
- 14 legislature containing the findings of the study conducted under
- 15 Subsection (b) of this section and any recommendations to the
- 16 legislature.
- 17 (e) The commission and the division may implement the single
- 18 intake form, automated intake system, and state case management
- 19 system if the commission and the division determine, based on the
- 20 study conducted under Subsection (b) of this section, that doing so
- 21 will result in no additional cost to the state.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act expires January 1, 2021.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
