6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 418.054 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 418.054. DEBRIS CONTRACT GUIDANCE FOR POLITICAL
9	SUBDIVISIONS. (a) In this section, "Hurricane Harvey" means the
10	hurricane of that name that struck the southeastern region of this
11	state in 2017.
12	(b) The division, in consultation with political
13	subdivisions and the Federal Emergency Management Agency, shall
14	identify common issues that occurred after Hurricane Harvey with
15	debris removal and monitoring contracts.
16	(c) The division, in coordination with the comptroller,
17	shall develop contracting standards and requirements for contracts
18	used by political subdivisions when contracting for long-term and
19	exigent debris removal and monitoring. The contracting standards
20	and requirements must:
21	(1) address the contracting issues identified under

- 1 multiple passes to remove debris; 2 (3) include provisions relating to requirements for contractors providing debris removal and monitoring services, such 3 as requiring the contractor to: 4 5 (A) have certain expertise; 6 (B) be based in a certain location; and 7 (C) have a certain number of employees and 8 vehicles in the contractor's fleet; (4) include provisions that enhance the ability of 9 political subdivisions to monitor contract compliance; and 10 (5) include bonding requirements and penalties for 11 12 failure to perform the contract. (d) The division shall develop: 13 14 (1) a contract template incorporating the contracting 15 standards and requirements developed under Subsection (c); and 16 (2) contracting guidance that provides political 17 subdivisions with an overview of federal contracting standards and 18 requirements. 19 (e) The division shall annually: (1) review federal statutory and regulatory changes to 20 procedures regarding contracting; and 21 22 (2) update the contract template and contracting quidance developed under Subsection (d) to reflect any changes. 23 24 (f) The division shall distribute an updated contract template or updated contracting guidance to political subdivisions 25
