A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT relating to emergency and disaster management, response, and recovery. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 418.002, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 418.002. PURPOSES. The purposes of this chapter are 8 to:

9 (1) reduce vulnerability of people and communities of 10 this state to damage, injury, and loss of life and property 11 resulting from natural or man-made catastrophes, riots, or hostile 12 military or paramilitary action;

13 (2) prepare for prompt and efficient rescue, care, and
14 treatment of persons victimized or threatened by disaster;

(3) provide a setting conducive to the rapid and orderly restoration and rehabilitation of persons and property affected by disasters;

(4) clarify and strengthen the roles of the governor,
state agencies, the judicial branch of state government, and local
governments in prevention of, preparation for, response to, and
recovery from disasters;

(5) authorize and provide for cooperation in disastermitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery;

24 (6) authorize and provide for coordination of

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1 activities relating to disaster mitigation, preparedness, 2 response, and recovery by agencies and officers of this state, and 3 similar state-local, interstate, federal-state, and foreign 4 activities in which the state and its political subdivisions may 5 participate;

6 (7) provide an emergency management system embodying
7 all aspects of predisaster preparedness and postdisaster response;

8 (8) assist in mitigation of disasters caused or 9 aggravated by inadequate planning for and regulation of public and 10 private facilities and land use; [and]

encourage state agencies, local governments, 11 (9) 12 nongovernmental organizations, private entities, and individuals to adopt the goals of the strategic plan of the Federal Emergency 13 14 Management Agency for preparing for, responding to, and recovering 15 from a disaster that emphasize cooperation among federal agencies, state agencies, local governments, nongovernmental organizations, 16 17 private entities, and individuals in each activity or project undertaken to ensure that this state is prepared to effectively 18 19 respond to and recover from a disaster; and

20 <u>(10)</u> provide the authority and mechanism to respond to 21 an energy emergency.

22 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is 23 amended by adding Sections 418.054 and 418.055 to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 418.054. UNMANNED AIRCRAFT STUDY GROUP. (a) In this</u> 25 <u>section, "study group" means the unmanned aircraft study group</u> 26 <u>established under this section.</u>

27 (b) The unmanned aircraft study group is established and

No. 2340 1 consists of the following members appointed by the chief of the 2 division: 3 (1) representatives of the division; 4 (2) representatives from institutions of higher education; and 5 6 (3) other appropriate interested persons. 7 (c) The study group shall study issues related to the appropriate use of unmanned aircraft in responding to and 8 recovering from a disaster, including: 9 10 (1) strategies for coordinating and promoting the use of unmanned aircraft among state agencies, local governments, and 11 12 private entities in the response and recovery; and (2) recommended changes to state law that would allow 13 state agencies, local governments, and private entities to more 14 15 effectively use unmanned aircraft in the response and recovery. 16 (d) Not later than November 1, 2020, the study group shall 17 submit a report containing recommendations on the issues described by Subsection (c) to each member of the legislature. 18 19 (e) The study group is abolished and this section expires January 1, 2021. 20 21 Sec. 418.055. INFORMATION SHARING WORK GROUP. (a) In this section, "work group" means the work group established under this 22 23 section. 24 (b) The division shall establish a work group of state agencies involved in disaster management. The work group consists 25 26 of members appointed by the chief of the division who represent: 27 (1) the comptroller's office;

13	(2) coordinate the agencies' responses to a disaster.							
14	(d) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,							
15	the work group shall submit the group's recommendations to the							
16	governor.							
17	SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is							
18	amended by adding Section 418.056 to read as follows:							
19	Sec. 418.056. PERMITTING TASK FORCE. (a) The division							
20	shall form a task force with representatives from the General Land							
21	Office, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, Parks and							
22	Wildlife Department, Texas Water Development Board, Texas A&M							
23	AgriLife Extension Service, Department of State Health Services,							
24	Public Utility Commission of Texas, and Texas Historical Commission							
25	to be activated if a state of disaster is declared under Section							
26	418.014 because of weather conditions to expedite:							
27	(1) environmental permitting; and							

(2) access to funds from federal disaster relief 1 programs following the disaster. 2 3 (b) The task force formed under this section shall develop recommendations for expediting the evaluation of environmental 4 5 permits during disaster recovery in order for local entities to demonstrate compliance with regulations and access 6 federal 7 disaster relief programs and funding. 8 (c) In performing its duties under this section, the task force may use resources of agencies participating in the task 9 10 force. SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 751, Government Code, is 11 12 amended by adding Section 751.017 to read as follows: Sec. 751.017. FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE AND 13 POLICY 14 RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING DISASTER ASSISTANCE. (a) The office, in 15 consultation with the Texas Division of Emergency Management, and, as practicable, federal agencies and members of Congress, shall: 16 17 (1) study federal laws and policies related to issues affecting the ability of federal agencies, state agencies, and 18 19 local governments to cooperate in responding to a disaster, including issues related to procurement, housing assistance, 20 information sharing, personnel, and federal disaster assistance 21 22 programs; and (2) make recommendations to improve federal laws and 23 24 policies related to the issues described by Subdivision (1). 25 (b) Not later than November 1, 2020, the office shall 26 deliver to the board a report of the recommendations described by Subsection (a) (2). 27
