1	AN ACT
2	relating to the requirement that state agency employees complete
3	cybersecurity awareness training.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter N-1, Chapter 2054, Government Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 2054.5175 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2054.5175. CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS TRAINING. (a)
8	This section applies only to a state agency that is a department,
9	commission, board, office, or other agency in the executive branch
10	of state government. This section does not apply to an institution
11	of higher education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code.
12	(b) Each state agency shall require all employees of the
13	agency who have access to the agency's network or online systems,
14	including electronic mail or Internet access, to complete training
15	on cybersecurity awareness. The training must:
16	(1) be designed, administered, and maintained by a
17	third-party vendor;
18	(2) include industry standards of content for
19	cybersecurity training;
20	(3) be capable of training at least 100,000 people;
21	(4) incorporate a management console allowing the
22	entering of the employee's first name, last name, electronic mail
23	address, state agency employer, and division in which the employee
24	is employed;

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1	(5) track the progress of an employee in completing
2	the training;
3	(6) generate reports, including reports that display
4	the progress in completing the training of:
5	(A) each division of a state agency;
6	(B) each state agency as a whole; and
7	(C) the entire state workforce;
8	(7) provide a flexible number of training licenses to
9	accommodate an unknown number of employees being trained each year;
10	(8) be regularly updated to include training about new
11	cybersecurity threats;
12	(9) have the ability to include content in addition to
13	cybersecurity awareness training, including training on human
14	resources policies and sexual harassment prevention;
15	(10) have the ability to display an image of the state
16	seal or a state agency's seal or logo;
17	(11) have the ability to create groups and allow
18	employees to be assigned to the groups;
19	(12) have the ability to assign training requirements
20	to specific groups of employees; and
21	(13) have the ability to send electronic mail
22	notifications that are customizable to employees enrolled in the
23	training.
24	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
