(a) A peace officer may possess and administer an epinephrine auto-injector in 13 14 accordance with this subchapter. 15 (b) A peace officer may possess and administer epinephrine 16 through an auto-injector device to a person in an emergency situation only if the peace officer has successfully completed 17 training in the use of the device in a course approved by the 18 commission. The commission, in consultation with the Department of 19 State Health Services, shall approve a training course on the 20 21 administration of epinephrine through an auto-injector device. 22 Sec. 1701.703.
