## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to participation by certain state employees in a default
- 3 investment product under a deferred compensation plan.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 609.007(c), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (c) To [Except as provided by Section 609.5025, to]
- 8 participate in a deferred compensation plan, an employee must
- 9 consent in the contract to automatic payroll deductions in an
- 10 amount equal to the deferred amount.
- 11 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 609.5025, Government
- 12 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 609.5025. VOLUNTARY [AUTOMATIC] PARTICIPATION;
- 14 PROVISION OF INFORMATION [DEFAULT INVESTMENT PRODUCT].
- SECTION 3. Sections 609.5025(b) and (h), Government Code,
- 16 are amended to read as follows:
- 17 (b) An employee <u>may elect to participate</u> [participates] in a
- 18 401(k) plan [unless the employee affirmatively elects not to
- 19 participate in the plan]. An [Notwithstanding Sections 609.007(b)
- 20 and (c), an] employee is [not] required to affirmatively contract
- 21 for and consent to participation in a plan under <u>Sections</u>
- 22 609.007(b) and (c) [this section].
- 23 (h) Within existing resources, a state agency participating
- 24 in a 401(k) plan shall inform new hires of their option to enroll

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- 1 [automatic enrollment] in a 401(k) account and their right to
- 2 opt-out of enrollment. Within existing resources, this information
- 3 shall be included as part of the new employee orientation process.
- 4 [State agencies participating in a 401(k) plan shall maintain a
- 5 record of a new hire's acknowledgement of receipt of information
- 6 regarding the ability to opt-out of enrollment in a 401(k) plan.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 659.102(a), Government Code, is amended 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) An employee of a state agency may authorize in writing a
- 10 deduction each pay period from the employee's salary or wage
- 11 payment for coverage of the employee under an eligible supplemental
- 12 optional benefits program. A deduction may be made each pay period
- 13 from the employee's salary or wage payment [without authorization
- 14 in writing from the employee] for participation in a 401(k) plan as
- 15 provided by Section 609.5025.
- SECTION 5. Sections 609.5025(c) and (g), Government Code,
- 17 are repealed.
- SECTION 6. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 19 to an officer or state employee who initially takes office or begins
- 20 employment on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
