A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of physicians to delegate to certain 3 pharmacists the implementation and modification of a patient's drug 4 therapy.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 157.101, Occupations Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (b-1) and adding Subsection (g) to read as 8 follows:

9 (b-1) A delegation under Subsection (b) may include the 10 implementation or modification of a patient's drug therapy under a 11 protocol, including the authority to sign a prescription drug order 12 for dangerous drugs, if:

(1) the delegation follows a diagnosis, initialpatient assessment, and drug therapy order by the physician;

15 (2) the pharmacist practices in a <u>federally qualified</u>
16 <u>health center, a</u> hospital, <u>a</u> hospital-based clinic, or an academic
17 health care institution;

18 (3) the <u>federally qualified health center</u>, hospital, 19 hospital-based clinic, or academic health care institution in which 20 the pharmacist practices has bylaws and a medical staff policy that 21 permit a physician to delegate to a pharmacist the management of a 22 patient's drug therapy;

(4) the pharmacist provides the name, address, and
telephone number of the pharmacist and of the delegating physician

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1 on each prescription signed by the pharmacist; and

2 (5) the pharmacist provides a copy of the protocol to3 the Texas State Board of Pharmacy.

4 (g) In this section, "federally qualified health center"
5 has the meaning assigned by Section 531.02192, Government Code.

6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
