- 8 establish sanitation rules to prevent the spread of an infectious

- 10 (b) Rules adopted under this section applicable to an
- 11 individual or facility regulated under Chapter 1602 must be
- 12 consistent with the standards and terminology related to safety and
- 13 <u>sanitation that are commonly used in the cosmetology industry.</u>
- SECTION 2. Section 1603.252(a), Occupations Code, is
