- 7 SUBCHAPTER C. DISPOSAL OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

- 9 Sec. 142.041. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "license
- 10 holder" means a home and community support services agency licensed
- 11 under this chapter to provide hospice services.
- Sec. 142.042. POLICY. (a) A license holder may adopt
- 13 written policies and procedures related to the disposal of a
- 14 patient's unused controlled substance prescription drugs on the
- 15 patient's death or in other circumstances in which disposal is
- 16 appropriate.
- 17 (b) A license holder that adopts policies and procedures
- 18 under this section shall:
- 19 <u>(1) provide a copy of the policies and procedures to</u>
- 20 the patient and the patient's family;
- 21 (2) discuss the policies and procedures with the
- 22 patient and the patient's family in a language and manner the
- 23 patient and patient's family understand; and
- 24 (3) document in the patient's clinical record that the

- 3 Sec. 142.043. EMPLOYEE TRAINING. (a) This section applies
- 4 to an employee of a license holder who is a health care professional

- 6 (b) A license holder may provide training to the employees
- 7 described by Subsection (a) regarding the secure and responsible
- 8 disposal of controlled substance prescription drugs in a manner
- 9 that discourages abuse, misuse, or diversion.
- Sec. 142.044. AUTHORIZED DISPOSAL. (a) If the license
- 11 holder has complied with Section 142.042(b) with respect to a
- 12 patient, a health care professional employee who has completed the
- 13 training under Section 142.043(b) may confiscate and dispose of a
- 14 patient's controlled substance prescription drug if:
- 15 (1) the patient has died;
- 16 (2) the drug has expired; or
- 17 (3) the patient's physician has given written
- 18 instructions that the patient should no longer use the drug.
- 19 (b) The employee confiscating the controlled substance
- 20 prescription drug shall dispose of the drug in a manner consistent
- 21 with recommendations of the United States Food and Drug
- 22 Administration and the laws of this state.
- (c) The disposal of a controlled substance prescription
- 24 drug under this section must occur at the location at which the drug

- 7 (4) the quantity of the controlled substance
- 8 prescription drug originally dispensed and the quantity of the drug
- 9 remaining; and
- 10 (5) the time, date, and manner of disposal.
- 11 (e) An employee shall document in a patient's file if a
- 12 <u>family member of the patient prevented the confiscation and</u>
- 13 disposal of a controlled substance prescription drug as authorized
- 14 under this section.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
