## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 411.00951 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 411.00951. CHECKPOINTS AT ENTRY POINTS FROM NEW MEXICO
8	OR OKLAHOMA. (a) The department shall establish a program for the
9	purpose of establishing state border crossing checkpoints to
10	prevent controlled substances from entering this state and for the
11	prevention and detection of other criminal offenses.
12	(b) A checkpoint shall be established under Subsection (a)
13	at each point located on a public highway or street leading directly
14	to a border between this state and New Mexico or Oklahoma.
15	(c) A checkpoint established under Subsection (a) shall be
16	operated in a manner as to only stop a motor vehicle:
17	(1) that is entering this state; and
18	(2) if law enforcement has probable cause to believe a
19	driver or passenger of the vehicle is bringing a controlled
20	substance into this state or has committed another criminal
21	offense.

(d) The department may establish the state border crossing

- 1 may share the cost of staffing the checkpoints.
- 2 (e) The department shall establish procedures governing the
- 3 encounter between the driver and the peace officers operating the
- 4 checkpoint that ensure that any intrusion on the driver is
- 5 minimized and that the inquiries made are reasonably related to the
- 6 purpose of the checkpoint. A peace officer at the checkpoint may
- 7 not direct a driver or a passenger in a motor vehicle to leave the
- 8 vehicle or move the vehicle off the roadway unless the officer has
- 9 reasonable suspicion or probable cause to believe that the person
- 10 committed or is committing an offense, including an offense
- 11 relating to the possession of a controlled substance. However, a
- 12 peace officer may require that each motor vehicle passing through
- 13 the checkpoint be diverted to a location immediately adjacent to
- 14 the roadway, if desirable, to ensure safety.
- 15 <u>(f) In this section:</u>
- 16 (1) "Controlled substance" has the meaning assigned by
- 17 Section 481.002, Health and Safety Code.
- 18 (2) "Motor vehicle" has the meaning assigned by
- 19 Section 541.201, Transportation Code.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
