Chapter 13, Code of Criminal Procedure, amended by adding Article 13.291 to read as follows: 6 Art. 13.291. CREDIT CARD OR DEBIT CARD ABUSE. An offense 7 under Section 32.31, Penal Code, may be prosecuted in any county in 8 9 which the offense was committed or in the county of residence for any person whose credit card or debit card was unlawfully possessed 10 or used by the defendant. 11

- SECTION 2. Article 38.19, Code of Criminal Procedure, is

- (2) Section 32.31 (Credit Card or Debit Card Abuse);

- 20 (3) Section 32.51 (Fraudulent Use or Possession of

- 22 <u>(b)</u> In the trial [trials] of an offense to which this
- 23 <u>article applies</u> [forgery], the attorney representing the state is
- 24 not required to prove [it need not be proved] that the defendant

- 1 committed the act with intent to defraud any particular person. It
- $2 \quad \underline{is} \quad [shall \ be]$ sufficient to prove that the $\underline{offense} \quad [forgery]$ was, in
- 3 its nature, calculated to injure or defraud any of the
- 4 sovereignties, bodies corporate or politic, officers or persons,
- 5 named in the definition of the offense [forgery] in the Penal Code.
- 6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to a criminal proceeding that commences on or after the effective
- 8 date of this Act. A criminal proceeding that commenced before the
- 9 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 10 date the proceeding commenced, and the former law is continued in
- 11 effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
